ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

The Minister of Transport has received an application from the National Union of Mineral Water Manufacturers Associations and the Scottish Federation of Limited Aerated Water Manufacturers Associations, being organisations representative of employers in the section of the road transport industry concerned with the conveyance of goods by road, which the Minister of Labour has certified to be proper bodies to make such an application, for the variation during certain months in the year of the periods of time laid down in Section 19 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended by Section 31 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933, for the employment of drivers of road vehicles of certain types.
