

**WEST DEVON ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION) SPECIAL ORDER, 1934.**

**ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS, 1882 TO 1933.**

**N**OTICE is hereby given that the Electricity Commissioners have submitted to the Minister of Transport for confirmation under the above-mentioned Acts a Special Order made by them in respect of part of the Urban District of Bude-Stratton and parts of the Rural Districts of Launceston and Stratton in the County of Cornwall and the Rural Districts of Broadwoodwidge and Holsworthy and parts of the Rural Districts of Bideford and Torrington in the County of Devon.

The Minister of Transport proposes to confirm the Order and gives notice that any person affected who may be desirous of objecting to the confirmation of the same must in accordance with the Electricity (Confirmation of Special Orders) Rules, 1931, do so by memorial addressed to the Minister of Transport written on one side only of foolscap paper and sent by registered post addressed to The Secretary, Ministry of Transport, 6, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1, and posted not later than the 27th July, 1934. A copy of any such memorial must also be sent in like manner to the West Devon Electric Supply Company, Limited, at 4, West Street, Tavistock, or to Messrs. Lees and Company, Palace Chambers, Bridge Street, Westminster, S.W.1, Parliamentary Agents for the Order. Such Memorial must be sealed or signed by the person objecting or by some responsible and duly authorised person on his behalf, and must state the specific grounds of objection to the Order and the modifications desired.

A copy of the Order as submitted for confirmation has been deposited for public inspection at the offices of (1) The Clerk of the Peace for the County of Cornwall, (2) The Clerk of the Peace for the County of Devon, and (3) The Clerks of the respective rural district councils of Holsworthy, Launceston, Stratton, Bideford, Broadwoodwidge and Torrington.

**LIVERPOOL ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION)  
(No. 2).**

**N**OTICE is hereby given that the Lord Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Liverpool (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") whose address is Municipal Buildings, Liverpool, have applied to the Electricity Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1933 for a Special

Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the area for the supply of electrical energy by the Corporation so as to enable them to provide and distribute electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1933 within the parishes or townships of Downholland, Melling and Simonswood in the rural district of West Lancashire in the County Palatine of Lancaster (hereinafter referred to as "the added area").

2. To authorise the Corporation to exercise within the added area all powers usually conferred upon distributors of electrical energy.

3. To authorise the Corporation to break up streets and parts of streets not repairable by the local authority and railways within the added area.

4. To make provision as to the maximum prices which may be charged by the Corporation for electricity within the added area.

5. To apply to the added area with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Liverpool Corporation Acts and Orders 1921 to 1932.

And notice is hereby also given that any authority, company, body or person desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objections respecting the application must do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Savoy Court, Strand, W.C.2, and despatched on or before the 30th day of July, 1934, and a copy of such objections must also be forwarded to the undermentioned Town Clerk or Parliamentary Agents.
