And whereas by virtue of an Order in Council dated the tenth day of November, nineteen hundred and thirty-two, made in pursuance of Section 67 of the Act, Part II of the Act came into operation in the United Kingdom on the first day of January, nineteen

hundred and thirty-three:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section 64, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to direct and it is hereby directed as follows:—
