At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 29th day of June, 1934.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 23rd day of June, 1934, (C.W. 5197/34), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council bearing dates 25th March, 1920 and 16th April, 1924, to approve payment of an allowance at the rate of £2 a day in addition to Half Pay, together with Lodging Allowance in the event of accommodation not being available, to Flag Officers and Officers of the Engineer Branch of corresponding rank while undergoing courses:

"And whereas attendance at these courses is no longer regarded as voluntary, but as an ordinary Naval Duty, to which the Officers are appointed in the same manner as Officers of lower rank who receive full pay and appropriate allowances while undergoing courses:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of Flag Officers and Officers of the Engineer Branch of corresponding rank when appointed for courses of instruction receiving the full pay of their rank and the appropriate rates of provision allowance, and lodging allowance when accommodation is not provided.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend John, Lord Bishop of Guildford, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:-

"We John Bishop of Guildford in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:

"There is in the County of Surrey and our Diocese of Guildford the Vicarage or Benefice of Milford the Parish whereof contains a population (according to the last census) of one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for four hundred persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Milford is Four Hundred and Four Pounds

or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of Godalming the Parish whereof contains a population (according to the last census) of four thousand four hundred and fifty-five or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for

five hundred and twenty-six persons.
"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Godalming is Five Hundred and Ninety-

Seven Pounds or thereabouts.

"A certain portion or district of the said Parish of Milford with a total population of one thousand or thereabouts is distant about one and a half miles from each of the Parish Churches of Milford and Godalming an increase of population having been caused therein by the Borough of Godalming using the district for a Housing Estate. A Mission Church is about to be erected to provide accommodation for Divine Worship for the inhabitants residing in that portion of Milford so to be separated therefrom.

"It appears to us and we do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the said portion or district of the Parish of Milford the boundaries of which are more particularly delineated on the plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation and thereon verged pink may be advantageously separated therefrom and annexed to the said Parish of

Godalming to which it is contiguous. "The Reverend Philip Giffard Holden the Vicar of the Benefice of Witley in the said County and Diocese is the patron of the said Benefice of Milford and the Reverend John Crichton Melville is the present Incumbent

"We John by virtue of our Bishopric are the patron of the Benefice of Godalming and the Reverend Canon George Silverton Richards is

the present Incumbent thereof.
"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we the said Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:-

" SCHEME.

"It is proposed:—
"I. That there shall be separated from the Ecclesiastical Parish of Milford and annexed to the Parish of Godalming a certain portion or district of the said Parish of Milford the boundaries of which are well known and defined and are delineated on the plan annexed hereto and thereon verged pink.

"2. That the Incumbent of Godalming shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within such portion so to be separated from Milford

and annexed to Godalming.

"3. That the inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Godalming but shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Church of Milford except nevertheless any such inhabitants or inhabitant (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Parish Church of Milford who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.
"4. That the inhabitants of the aforesaid

portion shall have such and the same right to marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the said Parish Church of Godalming but for the said separation they might have had in the Parish

Church of Milford.

"5. That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion so to be separated from the Parish of Milford and annexed to Godalming shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Godalming who shall have all such rights and remedies for enforcing payment of the same as are now or would in the future but for the said separation be exercisable by the Incumbent of the Benefice of Milford.

"6. That no alteration shall be made in respect of the tithe rent charges or other endowments of the said Benefices or either of

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said Scheme be carried into effect.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

Whereas by Section 3 sub-section (1) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, (16 and 17 Geo. 5, c. 53), it is provided that if, where an Order in Council has been made under that Act with respect to any goods, it is shown to the satisfaction of the Appropriate Department by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter that the application of the provisions of the Order or of some of those provisions to any particular class or description of those goods has caused or is likely to cause injury or hardship to the said persons or any of them, the Department may direct that the Order or any particular provisions of the Order shall cease to apply to goods of that class or description or shall apply to such goods subject only to such modifications and conditions as the Department think fit, and the Order shall, while the Direction is in force, have effect subject thereto.

And whereas it is provided inter alia by Article 1 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 3 Order 1934,* that it shall not be lawful to sell or expose for sale in the United Kingdom any imported bacon or ham unless it bears an indication of origin.

And whereas the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland acting jointly, being the Appropriate Department in this case, having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter, are satisfied that the application of the aforesaid provisions of Article 1 of the said Order to bacon or ham with the rind upon it prior to the 13th August, 1934, is likely to cause hardship to the said persons.

Now therefore the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3, hereby direct as follows:—

1. The Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 3 Order, 1934, shall not apply to any bacon or ham with the rind upon it when sold or exposed for sale by any person before the 13th August, 1934.

2. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 2), 1934.
