any one marked voltage from 100 to 120 volts inclusive or from 200 to 250 volts inclusive or from 400 to 440 volts inclusive.

Provided that the meter be constructed as described in the specification and drawings deposited at the National Physical Laboratory, Teddington, Middlesex, dated and numbered 28th September, 1933 and 16th October, 1933, and No. 142 and be in accordance with one of the pattern meters Nos. 1016266, 1016267, 1016270, 1016271 and 1016272, deposited at the National Physical Laboratory on the 6th January, 1934, by or on behalf of the Measurement Limited, Terminal House, Lower Belgrave Street, London, S.W.1, and sealed by the National Physical Laboratory at the interest of the Electricity Commissioners. stance of the Electricity Commissioners.

Electricity Commissioners further approve of the means provided for fixing meters of this description, and for connecting them with the service lines as described in the specification and drawings above referred to.

This approval is in substitution for the approval given by the Electricity Commissioners on the 11th May, 1934, which latter approval is hereby cancelled.

MEROHANDISE MARKS.

THE MERCHANDISE MARKS (IMPORTED GOODS) Exemption Direction (No. 2) 1934, DATED JULY TWELFTH, 1934, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES, THE SECRE-TARY OF STATE FOR THE HOME DEPARTMENT AND THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR SCOTLAND ACTING JOINTLY UNDER SECTION 3 (1) OF THE MER-CHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926 (16 & 17 GEO. 5.

Whereas by Section 3 sub-section (1) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, (16 and 17 Geo. 5, c. 53), it is provided that if, where an Order in Council has been made under that Act with respect to any goods, it is shown to the satisfaction of the Appropriate Department by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter that the application of the provisions of the Order or of some of those provisions to any particular class or description of those goods has caused or is likely to cause injury or hard-ship to the said persons or any of them, the Department may direct that the Order or any particular provisions of the Order shall cease to apply to goods of that class or description or shall apply to such goods subject only to such modifications and conditions as the Department think fit, and the Order shall, while the Direction is in force, have effect subject thereto.

And whereas it is provided inter alia by Article 1 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 3 Order 1934,* that it shall not be lawful to sell or expose for sale in the United Kingdom any imported bacon or ham unless it bears an indication of origin.

And whereas the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland acting jointly, being the Appropriate Department in this case, having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter, are satisfied that the application of the aforesaid provisions of Article 1 of the said Order to bacon or ham with the rind upon it prior to the 13th August, 1934, is likely to cause hardship to the said persons.

Now therefore the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3, hereby direct as follows:-

Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 3 Order, 1934, shall not apply to any bacon or ham with the rind upon it when sold or exposed for sale by any person before the 13th August, 1934.

2. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemp-

tion Direction (No. 2), 1934.
