At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 25th day of *July*, 1934.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 4th day of July, 1934 (C.W. 2933/34), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Section VI, Schedule V, to Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to sanction the payment of certain rates of Entertaining Allowance to officers of the rank of Captain and Commander in Your Majesty's Fleet, the rates for Captains being dependent upon the rate of Command Money payable:

“And whereas we are of opinion that the rate of Entertaining Allowance payable to a Captain should not necessarily be dependent upon the rate of Command Money payable:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us to pay Entertaining Allowance to Captains holding the prescribed appointments at the rate of 8s.,

5s. or 2s. 6d. a day at our discretion in conjunction with the payment of Command Money at the rate of 10s. a day.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
