(f) Conditional on the employment of a Curate to serve the District of Saint Aidan.

(g) Conditional on the employment of three Assistant Curates.

(h) Conditional on the employment at a stipend of not less than £150 per annum of a Curate to serve the area transferred from Stretford, Saint Matthew.

(i) Conditional on the employment of a Curate-in-Charge of the Conventional District of Marley Park.

(j) Towards the stipend of a Curate serving the new Mission Church in the Parish.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent for the time being of each of the Benefices whereof the names and the names of the Counties and Dioceses wherein the same are respectively situate are stated in the first three columns of the Schedule hereto, one yearly sum or stipend of sixty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable for the period commencing on the first day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four and terminating on the first day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight unless at any time before the expiration of the said period the grant of such stipend shall have been cancelled or withdrawn by a resolution of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and to be payable so long as the same shall continue in four equal portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August and the first day of November in each year: Provided always that such yearly sum or stipend or any quarterly portion thereof shall be payable

only upon the production to us on or after each of the said last mentioned quarterly days of payment of a certificate (in such form as may be required by us) under the hand of the Bishop of the Diocese in which the Benefice is situate certifying that, during the quarter then ended, there has been employed within the Parish of the Benefice and duly licensed by such Bishop such number of Assistant Curates as is stated in the fourth column of the said Schedule and that the last in order of such number of Assistant Curates has been in receipt of a stipend after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum; Provided also that such yearly sum or stipend is granted upon and is payable only subject to satisfaction of the further conditions (if any) stated with reference thereto at the foot of the said Schedule: Provided lastly that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned) shall operate only as a single grant in favour of each of the Benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.

## BYELAWS AND REGULATIONS

made by the Lord Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Nottingham and County of the same City acting by the Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") with respect to the tramways tramcars and trolley vehicles of the Corporation.

1. The Byelaws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Corporation and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Byelaws and Regulations.

2. Throughout these Byelaws and Regulations:—

(1) The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Corporation and having charge of a carriage;

(2) The expression "carriage" shall include tramcars and trolley vehicles;

(3) The expression "interior of a carriage" shall not include the upper deck of a covered carriage.

3. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the platform or other place of entrance or exit provided for that purpose and not otherwise.

When a carriage stops, no person shall board the carriage until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

4. No person shall enter, mount or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave any carriage in motion.

5. No passenger shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in or upon any part of a carriage in or on which a notice is exhibited that smoking is prohibited, and no person shall spit in, on, from or against any carriage.

6. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements, pamphlets, notices, handbills or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or paste notices or handbills or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any carriage.

7. A person in a state of intoxication shall not enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall leave the carriage immediately on being requested to do so by the conductor, and in the event of refusal to leave it shall be lawful for the conductor or any other officer or servant of the Corporation to remove such person from the carriage.

8. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

9. No person shall commit any nuisance in, on, or against any carriage or any premises or property used in connection with the Corporation's tramway or trolley vehicle undertakings.

10. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions, linings or any part of any carriage, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Byelaw and Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Byelaws and Regulations in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

11. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passen-

gers, shall not mount, enter or remain on or in any carriage, and may be prevented from so doing, and, if found on or in any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the same upon his fare, if previously paid, being returned: Provided that on carriages specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a carriage under the provisions of this Byelaw and Regulation on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

12. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation the fare legally demandable for the journey: Provided that no child under the age of three years who is not occupying a seat shall be liable to pay a fare.

13. Each passenger shall shew his ticket (if any), when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

14. No person travelling or having travelled in any carriage shall avoid or attempt to avoid payment of his fare. Any passenger paying for a stage less than the whole journey run by the carriage shall be deemed to have completed his journey at the end of the stage paid for; if the passenger remains on the carriage he shall pay the fare legally payable for the remainder of his journey as a new passenger.

15. No artisan, mechanic, daily labourer or other person issued with an artisan's, mechanic's or daily labourer's ticket shall use or attempt to use such ticket except during such hours and at such times as the Corporation may from time to time prescribe.

16. Personal or other luggage carried by passengers (including the tools of artisans, mechanics and daily labourers) shall be placed in such part of the carriage as the conductor may direct. No luggage which from its size or otherwise is in the opinion of the conductor unsuitable for conveyance in or upon a carriage shall be taken in or upon such carriage.

17. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation shall travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand on the upper deck, or sit on the railing, guards or buffers of any carriage, and any person so travelling, standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

18. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage.

19. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the carriage with the consent of the conductor.

20. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

21. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage except by permission

of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor or place any dog elsewhere in or on the carriage than as directed by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Byelaw and Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and, in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

22. No person shall travel in or on any carriage with loaded fire-arms, or with dangerous or offensive articles, tools or implements.

23. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Corporation, and no person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cords or any other part of a carriage or its equipment or do or cause to be done anything in such manner as to obstruct any carriage or to endanger the lives of persons therein.

24. If at any time a carriage becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the

amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available carriage the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the consent of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged carriage.

25. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any carriage, any breach of these Byelaws and Regulations, shall if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the carriage by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

26. The conductor shall enforce these Byelaws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof to the best of his ability.

27. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Byelaws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

28. There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use and in or about any premises or property used in connection with the Corporation's tramway or trolley vehicle undertakings a printed copy of these Byelaws and Regulations.

29. These Byelaws and Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of November, 1934.

30. From and after the date of the coming into force of these Byelaws and Regulations the Byelaws Rules and Regulations referred to in the Schedule hereto shall be repealed but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof.

NORTH WESTERN HAMPSHIRE JOINT PLANNING SCHEME.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1932.

NOTICE is hereby given that:—(1) On the twenty-fourth day of July, 1934, the Minister of Health notified his approval of the Resolution of the North Western Hampshire Joint Planning Committee dated the fifth day of March, 1934, deciding to prepare the above planning scheme with reference to an area comprising the whole of the Rural District of Andover, the whole of the Rural District of Kingsclere and Whitchurch, part of the Rural District of Romsey and Stockbridge and

part of the Rural District of Winchester. (2) A certified copy of the Map defining the area to which the resolution applies has been deposited at the Offices of the Andover Rural District Council, 31, High Street, Andover, the Offices of the Kingsclere and Whitchurch Rural District Council, Swan Street, Kingsclere, the Offices of the Romsey and Stockbridge Rural District Council, Duttons Road, Romsey, and the Offices of the Winchester Rural District Council, 7, St. Thomas Street, Winchester, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without charge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on weekdays (Saturdays 10 a.m. to 12 noon). (3) Any person

who is, or claims to be, an Owner of any property in the area, and any association representing owners of property within the Rural Districts of Andover, Kingsclere and Witchurch, Romsey and Stockbridge, and Winchester, and any local association representing business or industry may by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the North Western Hampshire Joint Planning Committee to register without charge his or their name and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the scheme.

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933,\* the development of land in the area during the preparation of the scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order and in addition the Councils of the Rural Districts of Andover, Kingsclere and Witchurch, Romsey and Stockbridge, and Winchester, are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period, with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of re-

moval or alteration without compensation under the scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited together with the aforesaid Map.

The North Western Hampshire Joint Planning Committee intend to proceed as soon as may be with the preparation of a Draft Scheme, and any suggestions as to the proposals to be included in the Draft Scheme, should be sent in writing to the Clerk of the Joint Committee.
