

time, but had no ill Consequence, His Majesty being very well again, and having been abroad the 27th and 28th. The two Galeons that were missing are arrived at Cadix.

Warsaw, June 30. The King of Poland held yesterday a great Council of War, and will in a few days begin his Journey to Lemberg. General Sapieha has put off for some time his Return to Lithuania; and we have Advice, that the Sieur Ozinsky is coming to Court with the chief of his Adherents, so that it is hoped the Differences between these two Parties may shortly be adjusted. We hear the Tartars have lately brought a considerable Supply of Provisions to Cambric, and that the Garrison of that place has received a Reinforcement of 500 Janizaries.

Vienna, July 2. Last Sunday the Czar made a Private Visit to the Emperor, and his Ambassadors are in a few days to have their Public Audience. The Troops of Saxe-Gotha and the other Auxiliary Forces which lately came from several parts of the Empire, are marched to Hungary; Prince Eugene's Army is ready in a short time to be going thither, his Equipages being already put on board. My Lord Paget's Secretary having received his Dispatches, he on his departure for Vienna will let our Readers know the nature of this matter, to Command the Ottoman Forces which are drawing together near that place.

Frankfort, July 9. The French Commander at Philipsherg having received Orders from the King his Master to deliver up that City to the Germans, has sent notice thereof to General Thungen, who is appointed by the Emperor to be Governor of the same, upon which the German Forces designed to be in Garrison there, are marching to that place, and, we hear, a great part of the French Garrison is already marched from thence. We have Advice, that the like Orders are come to the Governors of Eyrbourg and the Fort of Kehl, so that we daily expect an Account of the Evacuation of these Places, but that of Brisack will be delayed till the French have made an end of demolishing the bridge over the Rhine which joins to that City.

Hague, July 15. N. S. The States of Holland and Westfriesland have given Orders to their Commissaries to renew the Contracts for Farming the Publick Revenues in the several Places of this Province. Our Letters from Paris say, that our Ambassadors are preparing for their Publick Entry, which they design to make on the 27th Instant.

Warsaw, July 7. This Day was performed in the Chapel of St. George the Ceremony of the Installation of his Grace John Duke of Newcastle Knight and Companion of the most Noble Order of the Garter, by the Duke of Leeds and Lord of Dorset and Mansfield, Three of the Knights of the said Order Commended thence by the Sovereign, after the Achivements of the late King of Sweden and the Earl of Pembroke, two of the Knights of the said Order, created, had been shewed up according to Custom. The Ceremony being concluded in the Chapel, the Commissioners and the New Installed Knight (attended by the Officers of the Order, the Officers of Arms, the Picquets and Foot Knights) went up to the Inner Ward of the Castle, where, in the King's Guardchamber were two very large Oval Tables, at which his Grace the new Installed Knight entertained the Commissioners, and divers Persons of the chiefest Quality, (among whom was a Prince of Parma) with a very splendid Dinner; and at another Table below Stairs his Grace the Duchess of Newcastle entertained the Ladies of chiefest Quality, the King's Mutek playing at the Table both of the Knights and Ladies at Dinner time: Besides which there were several other Tables all nobly furnished for the rest of the Company, which was very numerous on this Occasion, and all things were performed with great Order and Magnificence.
