WHEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 7th day of March, 1904, it was provided that an Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia entitled The Extradition Act, 1903, should

have effect in the Commonwealth of Australia as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870:

And whereas by an Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia entitled The Extradition Act, 1933, the provisions of which are fully set forth in the Schedule appended to this Order, the said Commonwealth Extradition Act, 1903, has been amended in certain respects:
