## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 14th September, 1934, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 17th September, 1934, to Saturday, the 22nd September, 1934, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on 65-34085

the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made Orders under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming the Orders made on the 30th July, 1934, in relation to the Schemes prepared by the Essex Rivers Catchment Board under Section 4 (1) (b) of the Act, making provision for the alteration of the boundaries of the Lower Crouch and Roach Drainage District and the constitution of an elective drainage board therefor; and the abolition of the Dovercourt Drainage district within the Catchment area and the constitution of the Hamford Water Internal Drainage District and Board, and for matters supplemental thereto.

By Part III of the Second Schedule to the said Act, it is provided that if any person aggrieved by an Order desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, he may, within six weeks after the publication of this notice, make an application for the purpose to the High Court, and if any such application is duly made, the Court, if satisfied that the Order is not within the powers of the Act or that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any requirements of the Act not having been complied with, may quash the Order either generally or in so far as it effects the applicant.

COUNTY OF NORTHUMBERLAND JOINT  
VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

POOR LAW ACT 1930: SECTION 3.

78615.

(30th August, 1934.)

Whereas by the County of Northumberland Joint Vagrancy Committee Order, 1931 (in this order referred to as "the Order of 1931") the Minister of Health made provision for the combination of the county of Northumberland and the county boroughs of Newcastle-upon-Tyne and Tynemouth for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casual poor persons by a joint committee named the County of Northumberland Joint Vagrancy Committee;

And whereas the constituent authorities of the Joint Committee have made application to the Minister of Health for the amendment of the Order of 1931:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Health, in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 3 of the Poor Law Act 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order.

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the County of Northumberland Joint Vagrancy Committee (Amendment) Order, 1934.

(2) The Order of 1931 and this Order shall be construed as one and may be cited together as the County of Northumberland Joint Vagrancy Committee Orders, 1931 and 1934.

2. From and after the 1st day of October, 1934, the Order of 1931 shall be read and have effect as if in lieu of Article 9 thereof there were substituted the following Article, that is to say—

"9.—(1) It shall be the duty of the Joint Committee from time to time to take into consideration and furnish the Minister with their recommendations in regard to the following matters—

(a) the number and situation of the casual wards which should be provided by any council;

(b) the number of casuals for whom accommodation should be provided at any existing casual ward and at any casual ward proposed to be established in the combined areas;

(c) the closing of any casual ward in the combined areas.

(2) It shall also be the duty of the Joint Committee to take such steps, whether by public notice or otherwise, as shall be necessary with a view to the repression of begging and sleeping-out in the combined areas.

(3) The Joint Committee shall have power to repay to any council the whole or part of any expenditure incurred by the council in—

(a) the provision of accommodation for casuals in accordance with any requirement of the Minister (including any necessary acquisition of sites);

(b) the equipment, maintenance and management of casual wards with the like consent;

(c) the reception and relief of casuals;

(d) the transfer to an appropriate institution of any casual;

(e) the maintenance and care in such an institution of any casual so transferred;

(f) the burial of any casual;

(g) the maintenance, care and education of any casual, being a child in respect of whom the council have exercised the powers vested in them under Section 52 of the Poor Law Act, 1930;

(h) the removal of any casual to his place of settlement;

(i) the provision and supply of mid-day meals for casuals;

(j) the provision of surgical appliances to casuals:

Provided that before making any repayment of expenditure falling within any of the classes enumerated in sub-paragraphs (c) (e) (g) and (i) of this paragraph, the Joint Committee shall obtain the consent of the councils;

Provided also that before making any repayment of expenditure falling within the class specified in sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph, the Joint Committee shall obtain the consent of a majority of the councils.

(4) The Joint Committee shall also have power, with the approval of the Minister, to contribute by way of an annual subscription towards the support and maintenance of any institution which appears to the Joint Committee to be calculated to render useful aid in the administration of the relief of casuals.

(5) Subject to the statutory provisions and orders and regulations for the time being in operation, the Joint Committee may make rules in regard to the administration of casual wards within the combined areas, and in particular to the following matters, namely—

(i) times and methods of admission;

(ii) searching;

(iii) bathing, night clothing and bedding;

(iv) smoking;

(v) treatment of sick, aged and infirm casuals;

(vi) treatment of female and child casuals;

(vii) dietary;

(viii) discharge and detention; and

(ix) tasks;

and any rules so made shall be binding on each of the councils:

Provided that before making any such rules the Joint Committee shall notify the councils concerned of their proposals relating thereto and shall give a reasonable opportunity to every such council to make representation to the Joint Committee regarding the proposals.

(6) Nothing in this Order shall affect the powers and duties conferred or imposed on any of the councils in their capacity as a poor law authority, or shall deprive or relieve any of the councils of their powers, duties and obligations with reference to the relief of casuals, except so far as any such powers, duties or obligations are being exercised, undertaken or discharged by the Joint Committee in the execution of this Order."
