To empower the Applicants to purchase from the Tamworth Corporation the undertaking authorised by the Tamworth Corporation Electric Lighting Order, 1904, and to authorise the Tamworth Corporation to sell the same to the Applicants; to provide for the revocation of the said Order of 1904; and to make provision as to the date upon which the Order shall come into operation.
- 6. To confer upon the Applicants all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1933, and the enactments incorporated therewith and to alter vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.
