## WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department has made the following appointments of Medical Referees under the above Act, in place of the late Dr. O. J. Kauffmann, for all County Court Districts at present comprised in Circuits Numbers 21, 22, 25, 26, and 28:—

Professor Joseph George Emanuel, M.D., F.R.C.P., 10, Harborne Road, Edgbaston, Birmingham 15, with a view to his dealing with cases of industrial disease other than ophthalmic cases, cases of beat hand, beat knee and beat elbow, and cases of writer's cramp and telegraphist's cramp.

Bernard Clive Tate, Esq., M.B., B.Ch., 9, Newhall Street, Birmingham 3, with a view to his dealing in particular with dermatological cases.

In addition, the Secretary of State has appointed Edgar Coningsby Myott, Esq., M.D., B.S., to be a Medical Referee under the above Act with a view to his dealing with cases of

industrial disease other than ophthalmic cases, cases of beat hand, beat knee and beat elbow, and cases of writer's cramp and telegraphist's cramp, in the County Court Districts at present comprised in Circuit No. 26.

## FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1901 TO 1929.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 86 (1) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that on the 13th September, 1934, he made Regulations, under Section 79 of the said Act, to apply to all factories and workshops in which cellulose solutions, as defined in the Regulations, are manufactured, used or stored.

The Regulations, which are substantially in accordance with the revised draft issued on the 18th May last, may be cited as the Cellulose Solutions Regulations, 1934, and will come into force on the 1st November, 1934.
