“Whereas by Section 30 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted that the Admiralty with the approval of Your Majesty in Council, may, from time to time, make free grants of land, part of the lands vested in them by virtue of this Act, for the erection of buildings, and providing conveniences for places of worship, residence of Ministers, education of children or other public purposes (so that any such grant of land does not include any right to the minerals under the land granted, or comprise more than two acres in any one parish):

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following paragraph shall be inserted after paragraph (1) of Article 9:—

“(1A) A flying machine registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland and carrying passengers for hire or reward on a regular line or service of public air transport shall not, unless it is designed to manoeuvre on the water, be flown over the sea or any inland waters in such circumstances that, in the event of the stoppage of its engine or one of its engines, it would be unable to reach land.”

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of July, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Greywell, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Mapledurwell, the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Newnham, the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Nately Scures, the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Rotherwick and a part, namely the Chapelry of Up Nately, of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Basing, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the late Right Reverend Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said five Benefices of Greywell, Mapledurwell, Newnham, Nately Scures and Rotherwick and the said Chapelry of Up Nately duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Winchester and therein recommended the said union and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Winchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“And whereas the said Benefices of Greywell and Basing are now full, the Reverend Percy Edward Augustus Binns being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Greywell, and the Reverend Henry Massingberd Irvin being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Basing, and the said Benefices of Rotherwick, Mapledurwell, Nately Scures, and Newnham are at present vacant:

“And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefices of Greywell and Rotherwick now belongs to one and the same Patron:

“And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefices of Mapledurwell and Newnham now belongs to one and the same Body of Patrons:

“And whereas the share of the Patronage of the United Benefice when the union which is recommended and proposed in Clause 1 of this Scheme shall take effect which on a fair and just apportionment would be assignable in respect of the interest of the Patrons of the said Benefice of Basing would in our opinion be negligible:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Cyril, now Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents of the said Percy Edward Augustus Binns and Henry Massingberd Irvin (testified by their respective signing this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do

humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Greywell and a part of the said Benefice of Basing, namely all that detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Basing which is known as the Chapelry of Up Nately, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Benefice of Greywell with Up Nately' and that such Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Odiham.

"2. That the Benefice of Greywell with Up Nately (referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme), the said Benefice of Mapledurwell, the said Benefice of Newnham, the said Benefice of Nately Scures, and the said Benefice of Rotherwick shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Newnham with Rotherwick, Nately Scures, Mapledurwell and Greywell with Up Nately' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Odiham but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"3. That the union referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Greywell with Up Nately after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme and pending such avoidance the said four Benefices of Newnham, Rotherwick, Nately Scures and Mapledurwell shall upon the date aforesaid be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Newnham with Rotherwick, Nately Scures and Mapledurwell,' and that the United Benefice formed in accordance with the provisions of this Clause shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Odiham.

"4. That upon either of the unions referred to in Clauses 2 and 3 of this Scheme taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Newnham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That upon the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect a part of the endowment of the said Benefice of Basing namely all those Tithe Rentcharges commuted at £85 arising within the Parish of Up Nately and now or formerly payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Basing together with all capital sums of money, stocks and other Securities representing or being the produce of any sale, redemption or other conversion of all or any of such Tithe Rentcharges shall be transferred and annexed to the said Benefice of Greywell with Up Nately.

"6. That two Curates shall be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefices referred to in Clauses 2 and 3 of this Scheme, these recommendations and proposals being made to the intent that the Bishop shall have the power of requiring the appointment of two Curates in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of Subsection (b) of Section 18 of the said

Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, provided that the stipend to be assigned by the Bishop out of the revenues of the United Benefice to any Curate so required to be appointed may be such stipend as the Bishop may determine not exceeding £300.

"7. That upon the taking effect of the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme the patronage of the Benefice of Greywell with Up Nately shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Greywell and upon the taking effect of either of the unions referred to in Clauses 2 and 3 of this Scheme, the Patronage of the United Benefice shall become and be vested in the Patron of the said Benefices of Greywell and Rotherwick, the Patron of the said Benefice of Nately Scures and the Patrons of the said Benefices of Mapledurwell and Newnham and their successors and heirs respectively as tenants in common to the intent that on the occurrence of any vacancy of the United Benefice the nomination and presentation of a Clerk to such Benefice shall for ever thereafter be made by the said Patrons, their successors and heirs acting in concert.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Winchester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an appeal against the said Scheme has been made to His Majesty in Council by the Parochial Church Council of Basing with Up Nately, and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order in Council of the 9th day of October, 1933:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee having taken the said appeal into consideration, and the Appellants having intimated the withdrawal of the said appeal, Their Lordships reported to His Majesty in Council their opinion that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme be affirmed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by

Order of the 14th day of August, 1934, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the Parishes of the Benefices of Rowbarton, Saint Andrew, and Taunton, Saint James, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire and report as to the alteration of the boundaries of the said Parishes of Rowbarton, Saint Andrew, and Taunton, Saint James, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and therein recommended certain alterations of the boundaries of the said Parishes and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said alterations of boundaries which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“And whereas both of the said Benefices of Rowbarton, Saint Andrew, and Taunton, Saint James, are now full the Reverend Edward Rome Oxby being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Rowbarton, Saint Andrew, and the Reverend Edwin Ogden being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Taunton, Saint James:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Edward Rome Oxby (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. That (a) all that portion of the said Parish of Taunton, Saint James, which lies to the east of the said Parish of Rowbarton, Saint Andrew, and to the north of the middle of the Great Western Railway Line shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Rowbarton, Saint Andrew, and (b) all that portion of the said Parish of Rowbarton, Saint Andrew, which lies to the south of the middle of the said Great Western Railway Line shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Taunton, Saint James.

“2. That if, upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, the said Benefice of Taunton, Saint James, shall be vacant, then the alteration of boundaries referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme shall forthwith take effect, but if upon that day the said Benefice of Taunton, Saint James, shall be full, then the said alteration of boundaries shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Taunton, Saint James.

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bath and Wells has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an appeal against the said Scheme has been made to His Majesty in Council by the Vicar and Parochial Church Council of Taunton, St. James, and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee

of the Privy Council by Order in Council of the 21st day of December, 1933:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee, having taken the said appeal into consideration, reported to His Majesty in Council their opinion that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme be affirmed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council by Order of the 14th day of August, 1934, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Archbishop of York embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of York, Holy Trinity, Micklegate, is now full the Reverend Arthur Robert Lee being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of York, Saint John, Micklegate, is at present vacant:

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the total revenue of the Benefices hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice would be more than is required to form a competent provision for the United Benefice and that it is desirable that the surplus revenue should be applied as hereinafter recommended and proposed for the benefit of a certain other Benefice in the same Diocese having no competent provision belonging thereto:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Arthur Robert Lee (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of York, Saint John, Micklegate, and the said Benefice of York, Holy Trinity, Micklegate, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of York, Holy Trinity with Saint John, Micklegate', and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of York, Holy Trinity, Micklegate, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of York, Holy Trinity, Micklegate, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Arthur Robert Lee if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of York, Holy Trinity, Micklegate, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of York, Holy Trinity, Micklegate, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice, and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of York, Saint John, Micklegate, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold or disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of any such sale or disposal shall be held and applied by us, the said

Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the Benefice of York, Saint Martin, Micklegate, with Saint Gregory, in the said Diocese of York.

"6. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the united Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of York, Saint John, Micklegate, having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of York, Holy Trinity, Micklegate, having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"7. That upon the union taking effect a portion of the endowment or property of the said Benefice of York, Saint John, Micklegate, shall be severed or diverted from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated as follows, that is to say, a sum of £1,366 13s. 4d. Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock (being part of a larger sum of such Stock at present held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of York, (Saint John, Micklegate) shall be transferred and annexed to the Benefice of York, Saint Mary Bishophill Junior, in the said Diocese of York.

"8. That (a) if within a period of three years immediately following the day of the date upon which the said union shall take effect the Archbishop of York shall certify in writing to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that arrangements have been made which will render practicable the appropriation of the Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, for one or more of the purposes contemplated by Section 24 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, then the said Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, together with the site thereof and any other ground belonging thereto (not being a graveyard or burial ground) shall be appropriated accordingly, subject to such conditions, regulations and provisions as the Archbishop of York shall by Deed made pursuant to the said 24th Section, declare and appoint, but (b) if no such certificate shall be given by the Archbishop of York within the aforesaid period of three years then so soon as conveniently may be thereafter the Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and in that case the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of York under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other

expenses incidental to these matters, shall be held and accumulated by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as a fund for and towards the purchase of a suitable site for and the erection of a new Church for a District to be selected by the Archbishop of York as the District for which such Church shall be built; and any ultimate residue after the provision of a site for and the erection of such Church shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of York.

"9. That upon any provision for the appropriation or sale as aforesaid of the said Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, becoming effective (a) the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Archbishop of York may direct be transferred to the Church of Holy Trinity, Micklegate, York, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of York and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, or such of them as the Archbishop of York shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Archbishop of York for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of York which the Archbishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, as aforesaid, and (b) the register books of baptisms, marriages, and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, shall be transferred to the Church of the United Benefice.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the appropriation or sale and disposal of the Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the appropriation or sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the appropriation or sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint John, Micklegate, York, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

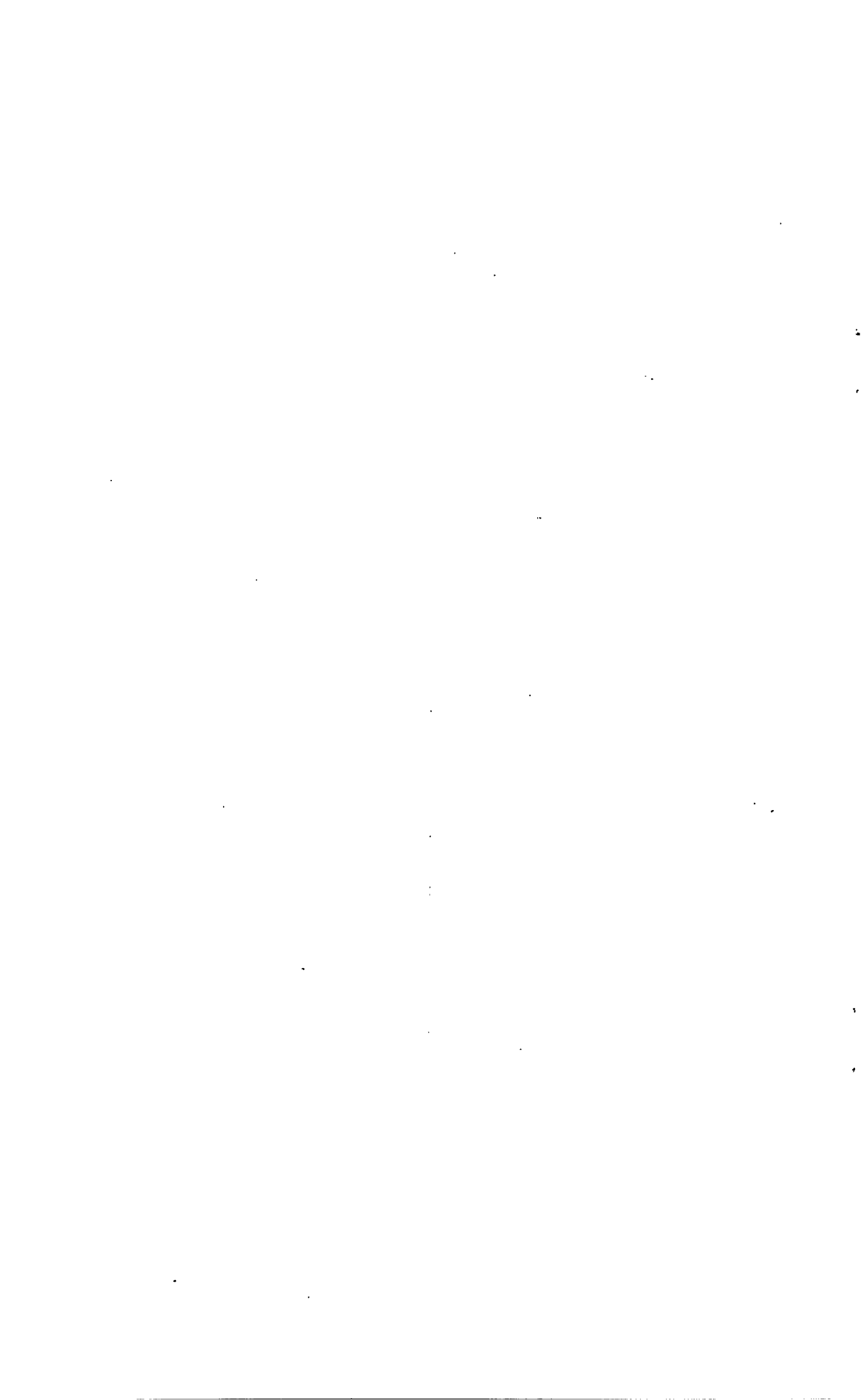
