or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Order in Council bearing date the 1st February, 1926, the Force consisting of officers and men of the Royal Navy employed under the Admiralty at Shore Wireless Telegraphy and Direction Finding Stations was established as the Royal Naval Shore Wireless Service with conditions of service and rates of pay related to those of the Telegraphist Branch of the Royal Navy:

"And whereas by Your Order in Council bearing date the 21st day of December, 1933, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to approve, inter alia, the payment as from the 1st January, 1934, of an allowance of one shilling a day to Warrant Telegraphists and Officers promoted therefrom serving in Flag Ships and in Ships of the Officers in command of Destroyer and Submarine Flotillas and to the Senior Warrant Telegraphist or Officer promoted therefrom carrying out instructional duties in the Signal School, Portsmouth, and at the Mediterranean Signal Training Centre, Malta:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the duties of the Officer of the Royal Naval Shore Wireless Service appointed on the staff of the Admiral Commanding Reserves for instructional duties in connection with the Royal Naval Wireless Auxiliary Reserve are sufficiently arduous and responsible to warrant the payment of similar additional remuneration:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment as from the 1st January, 1934, of an allowance of one shilling a day to the Chief Officer, Shore Wireless Service, or Senior Chief Officer, Shore Wireless Service, appointed on the staff of the Admiral Commanding Reserves for these duties.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the accessary directions herein accordingly.
