Provided always that such yearly sum or any portion thereof shall be payable only upon the production to us, from time to time, of a certificate (in such form as may be required by us) under the hand of the Bishop of the Diocese certifying that, during the period then ended, there has been employed within the Parish of the Benefice, and duly licensed by such Bishop an Assistant Curate in receipt of a stipend after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum. Provided also that the yearly sum so granted shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the Parish and Benefice.
