A considerable part of the forces lately disbanded from the service of the Duke of Lorrain, entred into Eurgundy, but without any invitation; nor are they entertained in any service. The Prince de Aremberg having received several complaints of divers insolvencies and exacttions used by them in the Country, has ordered his Officers to attend them, and if occasion require, to order them out of the Province

Monsieur de Louvigny having taken care for the entertainment of 2000 Foot, and 1000 Horse of the forces dismissed from the service of the Duke of Lorrains is upon his roturn, and may be suddenly expected here. Seven hundred Horse which came lately into Luxembourg are endered to be quartered in the Province of Syabant.

Letters even now artived from Mudrid bearing date the 6th instant inform es, that Don Juan was on his way from Parcellond, intending either for Confuegra or Guadululars, but has not yet permission to come neerer to Madrid, but that all differences feem to be fully composed.

The 20th instant serived here the Baron & Isola, and tackyeste day a conference with the constable of Castille. This evening is expected Monsieur de Pompons, Ambastador fom His most Christian Majesty to the States of the United Provinces, who stave sense Yacht to artend him at Antwerp for his transportation t with him is also expected Ion Hieronimo Quinones, who has been some time in the Greath Court under the Character of Envoye extraordinary from the Court of Spain.

The Confiable continues his care for the government and alescace of the Provinces, and for the eltablishment of the Militiain: such a posture as may be least burdensome to the people, and has ordered frong Garrisons to be drawn into all those places which lie most exposed to dangers and atgempts.

Hague; Feb. 12. We have daily fresh Reports of the private Levies made by the Bishop of Manjier, but nothing of his intentions and delign for their emploiment. Upon consideration of a Letter sent from the Governour of Loveverden, and the Remonstrance of the's of Groeningue who have sancied some grounds of jealousie from those Mistary preparations of the said Bishop, all Officers are ordered to repair to their respective postsupon the Frontiers, and to be wortful for the security of their charges. The States have sather resolved and ordered their sorces to be recruited with an addition of us men to each Company.

The Council of Sare having taken notice of the great decay of the fortifications willeveral of our Garrisons, by reason of the arriers of money due from divers of the Provinces, and charged on them if i that employment, have resolved than we the desertive Provinces to furnish and pay in their Quota's, that this necessary work may not be any longentretaided.

From Zealand we are told, that the inhabitants of Zirichzee having found shatche Scares of that Province in retenument of their late proceedings, in opposing the decrees of their Assembly, had lendfome Companies to block them up, and by that means to reduce them to reason, have upon

fecond thoughts consented to submit their differences to a friendly debate; whereupon the States remanding their Soldiers, the Town immediately dispatcht their Deputies to Middlebourg, where 'tis believed; an agreement will be made to satisfaction.

The Admiralties are all here affembled, where they are consulting about the charge and expences of the bleet, and are considering the best way and method of managing them to the best advantage, and are particularly taking an account of all payments which are made for the maintenance of the N.vy.

The Earl of Carlile, Ambassador from His Majesty of Great Britain to the Crown of Swedeland, having passed some few days here, departed this morning for Amsterdam, where he may continue till Monday next.

The States being till earnest for the delivery into their hands of the person larely seised in the Spanish Quarters as one of the accomplices in the scandalous Riot formerly committed upon the Congregation at Oudeman, the Spanish Ambassador has lately given in a Memorial, offering fomo reasons why it may not be judged fir to deliver him up to receive his punishment from them.

Bruges, Feb. 23. The French are bushly emploied at Dunkirk in enlarging and raising new fortifications about that place, upon which they have many hundred men chily employ'd, and have lately bought several Billanders both here and at Often is, which they make use of for the conveyance of their stress from Calico to Dankirk.

S me Holand stips having been lacen for this place and stopped at Oftend, upon pretence of a priviledge; that to strangers ships shall be permitted to pass oftend without unlading and paying their Customs there, and the goods so smalled no be sent in other vessels for this place; a dispute is hereupon risen between both places, which having been communicated to the Constable of Castille, he has been pleased to Order that the ships be at present permitted to pass, without prejudice to the pretensions or right of priviledge of these of Ostend, and will take the business in dispute into his farther consideration, to the end it may receive a speedy and equirable determination.

Pair, Feb. 27. His Majesty has ordered 300 light horsemen of his Army to be joyned with the other success defigned by him for the relief of Candia, who are to emilibark with their horses to form a squadion to be commanded by the Marquis de Francieres, an ancient Collonel. His Majesty has farther ordered 200 reformed Foot-Officers to embark for this service in the room of a many of his Guards of the body who are countermanded.

The Sieurde Biet, an ancient Mareshal de Camp is to be sent in the sine quality for Candia with the Sieur Caster, Captain Lieutenant of His Majelties Musqueteers, who we made also a Mareshal de Camp, and both of them to serve under the command of the Duke de Navaille. The Mase-shal de Craquy is in this expedition to command the Gallies, of which he is the Ger eral.

By a ship lately strived from America we are told, that a French man of War having in those seas met while a Spanish ship rich'y laden to the value of three hundred thousard Crowns, after a long and sharp sight, wherein the French Commander the Sieur du Plessis with many of his men was kil'ed, it e Spanish ship was socied to yield, and has been by the French Governout of our Plantations there adjudged go d Prize, having been taken beyond the Line.
