ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

The Minister of Transport in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (3) of Section 19 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930 (hereinafter called "the Act"), as amended by Section 31 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933, has made an Order as follows:—

- 1. In the case of heavy locomotives, light locomotives, motor tractors and motor vehicles constructed to carry goods other than the effects of passengers and authorised to be used under A or B licences issued in England or Wales:—
 - (a) paragraph (i) of sub-section (1) of Section 19 of the Act shall be varied so as to provide that where in any period of 24 hours one period of duty only is worked not exceeding 8 hours in length then the limit of 3 hours may be substituted for the limit of 5½ hours imposed by the said paragraph in respect of a continuous period of driving if the driver of the vehicle is allowed intervals of rest and time for refreshment of not less than 40 minutes in the aggregate, and if one such interval is of not less than 20 minutes to be taken not earlier than 2 hours after the beginning of the 8 hours' period of duty; and
 - (b) paragraph (ii) of sub-section (1) of Section 19 of the Act shall be varied so as to provide that where a driver is employed by the week and receives at least one complete day's rest of 24 hours in each week on not more than 2 days in any week the limit of 12 hours may be substituted for the limit of 11 hours imposed by the said paragraph in respect of the aggregate of continuous periods of driving, provided that some part
