If at any time it should appear that a Fellow in this Class is not complying with the conditions of his tenure, the Governing Body may, by a vote in which two-thirds of those present and voting concur, remove him from his Fellowship, or transfer him to a Fellow-ship in Class E for the remainder of the tenure of his Fellowship.

11. Of Fellows in Class B.

- (1) Fellows holding one or more of the qualifying offices of Dean, Bursar, Tutor, Assistant Tutor, and Lecturer of the College shall be Official Fellows and shall retain their Fellowships so long as they hold any of the above offices.
- (2) Any person whether a Fellow in Class A, or not, eligible to hold a Reserved Fellowship, or who has been appointed to a post making him so eligible although his tenure may not have commenced, may be elected to hold an Official Fellowship, in the first instance until the end of the academical year in which he is elected, and for the ensuing year. The Governing Body shall have the power to re-elect such Fellow annually at the meeting for the election of College Officers. The tenure of such a Fellowship shall however terminate if the holder ceases to be eligible to hold a Reserved Fellowship. The Council may require of any such Fellow as a condition of the tenure of his Fellowship that he shall perform such duties as they may from time to time prescribe, provided that they do not conflict with the duties of his University post.

A Fellow holding a Fellowship under paragraph (1) of this Statute and whose tenure of a qualifying office will expire within a period of six months, may have the tenure of his Fellowship prolonged by election in accordance with this paragraph subject to the prescribed conditions.

(3) Any person of exceptional distinction may be elected in accordance with Statute 9 to hold an Official Fellowship for periods of not more than six years at a time whether he be at the time a Fellow in Class A, Class B or Class E, or not, except that such election shall not be made save with the concurrence of the votes of not less than two-thirds of those present. The tenure of a Fellow elected under this paragraph shall not be prolonged beyond the end of the academical year in which he He shall fulfil any attains the age of 65. reasonable conditions which may be imposed by the Governing Body at each election.

12. Of Fellows in Class C.

(1) Persons holding University appointments such as certain Professorships, Readerships or other posts prescribed by the Statutes or Ordinances of the University shall be qualified for election into Fellowships in this Class. Such a Fellow shall hold a Fellowship in this Class so long as he holds the University appointment with which it is associated.

(2) A Fellow holding a Fellowship in another Class who becomes qualified to hold a Fellowship in this Class shall automatically have his Fellowship transferred to this Class for a period of three calendar months from the date of the commencement of his University appointment. If during this period he shall not be elected to a Fellowship in this Class, his Fellowship shall lapse at the end of the period of three months aforesaid.

(3) The Master shall inform the Vice-Chancellor whenever the number of Fellows holding Fellowships in this Class falls below the number prescribed by the University Statutes.

13. Of Fellows in Class D

(1) The Master on retirement shall become a Fellow in Class D.

(2) A Fellow who has held a Fellowship in Class B, Class C or in Class E under paragraph (3) of Statute 14, for twenty years in the aggregate shall, on ceasing to hold a Fellowship in any of these Classes, become a Fellow in Class D.

14. Of Fellows in Class E

(1) A Fellow in Class A, Class B or Class C, whose tenure of a Fellowship will expire within a period of six months, may be elected to a Fellowship in Class E to be held from the date of expiry of the Fellowship already held. Any ex-Fellow may be elected to a Fellowship in Fellows so elected may be rethis Class. elected from time to time.

The period and conditions of tenure shall be determined in each case by the Governing Body at the time of election or re-election.

- (2) A Fellow in Class A may signify to the Master in writing his wish to become a Fellow in Class E. If the Governing Body consent he shall remain a Fellow to all intents and purposes, and hold his Fellowship for the time and in the manner applicable to his former Fellowship, and enjoy all the benefits and advantages of the same, except that he shall not thenceforth be entitled to any Fellowship dividend. If such a Fellow is entitled to be re-elected to a Fellowship in Class A, he may be re-elected to a Fellowship in Class E under the same conditions and for the same period.
- (3) A Fellow in Class B may similarly have his Fellowship transferred to Class E at his own request with the consent of the Governing He shall similarly be entitled to all the privileges of his former Fellowship, except that he shall not thenceforth be entitled to any Fellowship dividend. He shall continue to hold his Fellowship so long as he holds a qualifying office, or, if he held a Fellowship in Class B under paragraph (2) of Statute 11, he may be re-elected annually under the same conditions to a Fellowship in Class E. If he held a Fellowship in Class B under paragraph (3) of Statute 11, he may be re-elected from time to time in accordance with the provisions of that paragraph.

(4) A Fellow in this Class shall be counted as one of the Stipendiary Fellows for the purpose of computing the number of Stipendiary

Fellowships required to be reserved.

(5) If a Fellow in this Class is qualified to hold a Reserved Fellowship, his Fellowship shall be counted in the number of Reserved Fellowships.

In the first line, delete "and Entrance Exhibitions."

After "elected without limit of age." insert: Entrance Exhibitions shall be awarded only to candidates whose attainments have been decided by open examination held by the College acting either singly or as a member of a group of Colleges, except that Exhibitions
