

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section 36 is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to direct, and it is hereby directed as follows:—

1. The provisions of Part I of the Act (with the exception of the provisions set out in the first part of the Schedule hereto) and the provisions of the Preamble to and Sections 71, 72 and 73 of the Act in so far as they relate to the provisions of Part I hereinbefore mentioned shall extend to the Isle of Man with the adaptations and modifications specified in the second part of the Schedule.

2.—(a) The provisions of Part I of the Act set out in the third part of the Schedule hereto, which are expressed to apply only to British ships or passenger steamers registered in the United Kingdom, shall apply to British ships or passenger steamers, as the case may be, registered in the Isle of Man;

(b) References in the provisions of Part I of the Act set out in the third part of the Schedule hereto to a port in the United Kingdom shall be construed as including references to a port in the Isle of Man.

3. The provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Wireless Telegraphy) Act, 1919, as amended by the Act shall extend to the Isle of Man and any such provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Wireless Telegraphy) Act, 1919, which are expressed to apply only to British ships or passenger steamers registered in the United Kingdom shall apply to British ships or passenger steamers, as the case may be, registered in the Isle of Man.

4. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping Safety Convention (Isle of Man) Order, 1934, and shall come into force on the first day of January, 1935.

Adaptations and Modifications.

1.—(a) In Section 10 and Section 20 for the words "United Kingdom", wherever they occur, there shall be substituted the words "Isle of Man", and in the said Section 10 the reference to Section two-hundred and seventy-five of the principal Act shall be omitted.

(b) Section 38 shall have effect as if in the definition of "Country to which the Safety Convention applies" there were substituted

for the words "under the last foregoing section" the words "by His Majesty in Council".

(c) Section 72 shall have effect as if for the word "summarily" there were substituted the words "at the suit of the Attorney General of the Isle of Man, any officer of Customs the Chief Constable or any officer of police before a High Bailiff or two Justices of the Peace".

2. In the sections of the Act specified in the first column of the Table set out below there shall be substituted for the references to the sections of the principal Act specified in the second column of the said Table references to the sections of the Isle of Man Merchant Shipping (Passenger Steamers Survey) Act, 1885 specified in the third column of the said Table.

WHEREAS by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, 53-4 V. c. 37, it is amongst other things provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council by Order to direct that certain enactments shall extend with or without any exceptions adaptations or modifications in the Order mentioned to any Foreign Country in which for the time being His Majesty has jurisdiction:

And whereas by Section 106 of the Companies Act, 1929, it is amongst other things provided that the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, shall have effect as if Sections 103, 104 and 105 of the Companies Act, 1929, were included among the enactments which by virtue of the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, may be applied by Order in Council to Foreign Countries in which for the time being His Majesty has jurisdiction:
