

" 2. That the Church of the Parish of Whitehaven, Christ Church, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Whitehaven, Christ Church, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said George Wilfrid Arnold if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Whitehaven, Holy Trinity, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 5. That upon the union taking effect a Curate shall be employed to assist the Incumbent of the United Benefice in the performance of the duties thereof and that a part of the endowment of the United Benefice, that is to say, an annual sum of £140, being part of an annual payment of £287 at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, shall be appropriated and paid by us to the Incumbent of the United Benefice conditionally upon the employment of such Curate.

" 6. That upon the said union taking effect and pending the provision of a Parsonage House more suitably situated the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 7. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Holy Trinity, having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" 8. That with the consents of the Patrons of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, namely the said Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle (whose consent is testified as aforesaid), the Right Honourable Hugh Cecil Lowther, Earl of Lonsdale, K.G., G.C.V.O., Lewis Thomas Helder of Lyndhurst, Whitehaven, Esquire, Edward McCray of Meadow View, Whitehaven, Esquire, and the Venerable John Henry Hopkinson, Archdeacon of Westmorland (whose consents are testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect a part of the endowment and property of the United Benefice, that is to say (a) a sum of £100 per annum being part of the annual payment of £287 at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners (as hereinbefore mentioned), to the

Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, and (b) a capital sum of £1,500 held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, on behalf of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, shall be excepted out of the union and shall be held and accumulated by us for and towards the endowment of a new District proposed to be formed wholly or partly out of the Parish of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Carlisle has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Carlisle.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and
