

known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts," duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of December, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Thornhill, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Thornhill has been improved by means of certain leases and sales of glebe lands and of minerals within and under the glebe lands belonging to the said Benefice, which leases and sales were granted and carried out under the authority of the said Acts, with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by former Incumbents and by the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Thornhill:

"And whereas the proceeds of the said leases and sales have been invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts, and the investments so made include (*inter alia*), first, a sum of £2,837 14s. 11d. India £3 per centum per annum Stock, and secondly a sum of £10,647 11s. 6d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock, which sums of Stock are now held by us in trust to pay to the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon, but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts with respect to taking a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said Benefice from the said leases and sales payable to us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the Acts mentioned:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said leases and sales exceeds the annual sum of £600, and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be considerably in excess of £600:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Thornhill is now full, the Reverend Henry Telford Hayman being the Rector or Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date at which the said Benefice of Thornhill shall from whatsoever cause be next voided, or from the date of the cessation of any pension which may become charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice in favour of the said Henry Telford Hayman upon his resignation therefrom, the interest or dividends arising in respect of the said sum of £2,837 14s. 11d. India £3 per centum per annum Stock and also of a sum of £10,495 11s. 9d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock (being a portion of the said

sum of £10,647 11s. 6d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock) or in respect of any securities or investments from time to time representing the said sums of £2,837 14s. 11d. India £3 per centum per annum Stock and £10,495 11s. 9d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock shall cease to be held or received by us for the benefit of the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Thornhill and shall be held and received by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the Notice of the foregoing Scheme, which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, has been given by the said Commissioners to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Thornhill, and the said Patrons have not made any objection to the said Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Wakefield.
