APPEAL PROCEDURE.

THE GAS (APPEAL PROCEDURE RULES), 1934, DATED 31ST DECEMBER, 1934, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 16 OF THE GAS REGU-LATION ACT, 1920, AND SECTION 28 OF THE GAS Undertakings Act, 1934.

The Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 16 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, and Section 28 of the Gas Undertakings Act, 1934, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf hereby make the following Rules:-

- 1.—(1) These Rules may be cited as the Gas (Appeal Procedure Rules), 1934, and shall come into force on the first day of January, 1935.
