RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

UNEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE ACT, 1934.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Unemployment Assistance Board, after the expiry of at least forty days from this date, in pursuance of the power conferred upon it by Section 52 (1) of the Unemployment Assistance Act, 1934, to make Rules:—

(1) as to the date as from which determinations under the said Act shall have effect and as to the period for which such determinations shall remain in force and as to the review of such determinations:

(2) as to determinations granting an allowance for the maintenance of an applicant at a training course or course of instruction:

(3) as to determinations providing for the issue of the whole or part of an allowance to an applicant on whom the applicant for the allowance in question is dependent or by whom he is ordinarily supported:

(4) as to the issue of allowances.

And notice is hereby further given that on account of urgency the Unemployment Assistance Board has, under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made The Unemployment Assistance (Determinations) Provisional Rules, 1935, to come into force as Provisional Rules on confirmation by the Minister of

Labour and to continue in force until Statutory Rules have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act.
