WATER SUPPLIES (EXCEPTIONAL SHORTAGE ORDERS) ACT, 1934.

Re ALWEN RESERVOIR, DENBIGHSHIRE.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Minister of Health on the application of the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Birkenhead in the county of Chester (hereinafter called the Corporation) and in exercise of his powers under the Water Supplies (Exceptional Shortage Orders) Act, 1934, has made an Order under the above Act modifying the statutory obligations to which the Corporation are subject as respects the quantity of compensation water which the Corporation are required during every day of twenty-four hours to discharge into the River Alwen from their Reservoir at Alwen in the County of Denbighshire and prescribing that the quantity to be discharged as from the 17th January, 1935, until the 31st March, 1935, inclusive shall be not less than 1,500,000 gallons

per day and as from the 1st April, 1935, not less than 3,000,000 gallons per day. The Order comes into operation on the 17th January, 1935, and will continue in force for a period of six months or until the Alwen Reservoir is filled to overflow level whichever is the shorter period.

BARTON-ON-HUMBER ELECTRICITY SPECIAL ORDER.
