energy within the area of supply and to prescribe the minimum charge or charges to be paid by persons supplied with electricity by the Company or connected to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order.

4. To authorise the Company to open and break up streets and parts of streets which are not repairable by the local authority and railways and tramways in the area of supply.

5. To prescribe the period within which the Barton-upon-Humber Urban District Council may under Section 2 of the Electric Lighting Act, 1888 give notice to the Company of their intention to purchase the undertaking to be authorised by the Order.
