The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in attending envelope folding and envelope printing machines in the main machine room and attending Latexing machines in Nos. 1 and 2 departments at the Chadwell Heath Mill of Pirie, Appleton & Company Limited, Grove Road, Chadwell Heath, Essex, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours, mess-room accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACTS, 1925 TO 1934.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 29th January, 1935, he made a Scheme under Section 47 of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1925, as extended by the Workmen's Compensation (Silicosis and Asbestosis) Act, 1930, directing that the Various Industries (Silicosis) Scheme, 1931, shall be further amended and take effect as follows:—

The following trade and process shall be included in sub-paragraph (viii) of paragraph 2:—

“Haematite Iron Ore Mines:—
any operation underground.”

The Order will come into force on the 1st March, 1935, and will apply to workmen employed in any such operation at any time on or after the date of the Order.
