OUR Senate have ordered two Gallies to be forthwith fitted out to cruise against the Corsairs of *Barbary*, of whom we hear there are several abroad in these Seas. Two of the Gallies of *Tunis* are lately come into our Port, one of which has on board the Count *de Lenos* General of the Neapolitan Gallies, who is going to *Naples*. The Moscovite Prince *Szeremet*, and several other Moscovites, are lately arrived here from *Venice*, and design in a few days to go to *Milan*. By a Felucca come hither in 7 days from *Barcelona* we have advice, that 14 French Gallies put into that Port on the 30th of the last month, and would depart thence in a day or two for *Cadix*.

Turin, July 12. The Duke of *Savoy* went last Wednesday to *Rocca* near *Mondovi*, to view his Forces which are now encamped near that place, and will continue there most part of the Summer: On the 20th Instant he designs to go to *St. Maurice*, and to make some stay at that place. The Marquis of *Leganez*, late Governor of *Milan*, arrived here last Saturday from *Milan*, and sets out to-morrow for *Madrid*. The Duke of *Savoy* has caused an Edict to be published, pursuant to the late Treaty between him and the Most Christian King, forbidding the *Vaudois* who are his Subjects to have any Communication with the Subjects of *France*, and requiring all the French Protestants that are settled in his Dominions on pain of Death to depart the same within two months.

Venice, July 18. Last week came in here the *Jacob*, *Prosperous-African*, and *Resolution* Merchant Ships, and this day the *Samuel*, Capt. *Hart* Commander. We have received an Account from *Napoli di Romania*, that the Ottoman Fleet was come out of the *Dardanelles*, and lay off of the Island of *Natoluzo*, and that the Capt. General *Mocenigo* had thereupon ordered, all the Ships under his Command, to be ready, forthwith to put to Sea, and would sail in few days to meet the Enemy. Our Letters from *Carraro* of the 17th past say, a Party of Turks were come near *Tribigue* in *Dalmatia*, with a design to make an Incurfion in those parts, but upon the approach of our Forces they retired in great haste.

Warsaw, July 17. The King of *Poland* is now on his way to *Lemberg*, where it is believed he will arrive about the 19th or 20th of this month. The Forces of this Kingdom are marching thither from their several Quarters with all possible expedition. Part of the King's Forces which come from *Saxony* and *Hungary* are already arrived on the Frontiers, as likewise a considerable

Train of Heavy Cannon, with all sorts of Ammunition from *Dresden*. The rest of the Troops are ordered to hasten their march thither; and 'tis expected the whole Army will be joined together by the end of this month, and in a readiness to open the Campaign, which 'tis still said, will be done, with besieging, or at least blocking up of *Gaminick*. The Negotiation for Composing the Differences between the Families of *Sapieha* and *Oginsky* are still carried on, though hitherto with little success, each side insisting on their own Demands, and being as unwilling to comply with what is desired by the other.

Vienna, July 19. Prince *Eugene* of *Savoy* will set out next week for *Hungary*, and Admiral *Affsenberg* is preparing to go and command the Emperor's Fleet on the *Danube*, waiting only for the arrival of some Seamen from *Hambourg*, who are on their way hither, to serve on board the 6 new Vessels which were lately built near this City, and lie ready to fall down to *Peter-Waradin*, as soon as they are completely Manned. Our Letters from *Hungary* say, the Enemy have not yet attempted any thing against *Titul*, the Country thereabouts being so overflowed by the late Rains, that it was impossible for them to attack it by Land; and that the Turks who are assembled near *Belgrade*, have lately received a Reinforcement of about 4000 Men. In the mean while our Forces are drawing together at their General Rendezvous, where it is hoped they will be all arrived by the latter end of this month. The Czar of *Moskovy* continues still here; his Ambassadors have not yet desired a publick Audience of the Emperor, but it's believed they will, in few days.

Paris, July 31. The Court returned this week to *Versailles*. Major *Jordan*, Envoy Extraordinary from *Poland*, has had Audience of the King, and notified to him the King of *Poland*, his Master's Accession to the Crown. Monsieur *de Vendojme*, Grand Prior of *France*, was by the King's Order committed yesterday to the Bastille, on account of some disrespectful Words he gave the Prince of *Coxi* in a Dispute which happened between them the night before. We hear from *Brest*, that 7 Men of War of about 50 Guns each are sitting out there and in other Ports at the Expence of several Merchants, who, it is said, design to send them to the Southern Islands.

Brussels, July 29. The Elector of *Bavaria* went last Sunday to *Maricmont*, and is expected back in a day or two. We hear from *Liege*, that the Elector of *Cologne* has given Orders to reinforce the Garrison of *Dinant*, and has made the Count *de Heers* Governor of that place, and the Baron of *Roost* Governor of *Huy*. Our Advices from the French Conquests say, they are adding some new Works to the Fortifications of *Furnes*, and
