ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT, 1931.

A draft Regulation made on the 17th December, 1934, by the Architects Registration Council of the United Kingdom under Section 13 of the above-mentioned Act has been submitted for the approval of the Privy Council and is published herewith.

Representations by persons to whom the Regulation is applicable may be made in writing to the Privy Council on or before the 13th day of March, 1935.

The Architects' Registration Council at their meeting held on the 17th December, 1934, resolved that the existing Regulation No. 36 be added to in manner following:—

“An applicant for registration whose application has been rejected by the Council on two or more occasions shall on every subsequent occasion when re-submitting the application for further consideration pay to the Council a special fee of 10s. towards the expenses involved in such further consideration.”

THE FOREIGN PARCELS (SMALL PACKETS) (CUSTOMS) AMENDMENT (NO. 1) WARRANT, 1935. DATED 1ST JANUARY, 1935.

We the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in exercise of the powers conferred on us by Section 14 of the Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf do by this Warrant made on the recommendation of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise and of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by their respectively signing the same) order direct and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign Parcels (Small Packets) (Customs) Warrant, 1930, hereinafter called “the Principal Warrant.”

2. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (b) of Article 3 of the Principal Warrant:—

“(b) does not exceed two pounds in weight, or two feet in length, breadth or depth, or three feet in length, breadth and depth combined. If made up in the form of a roll, the length and twice the diameter shall not exceed three feet three inches and the greatest dimension shall not exceed two feet eight inches.”

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1935.
