

Archdeaconry; fourthly, the Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Camberwell, hitherto in the said Rural Deanery of Kennington, shall be transferred to the said Rural Deanery of Camberwell; fifthly, the Parish of Saint Olave, Mitcham, at present in the Rural Deanery of Beddington, in the said Archdeaconry of Kingston-upon-Thames, shall be transferred to the said Rural Deanery of Streatham; and sixthly, the following Parishes shall be transferred from one Rural Deanery to another within the said Archdeaconry of Kingston-upon-Thames, that is to say, the Parish of Burstow, at present in the Rural Deanery of Godstone, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Reigate, and the Parish of Chaldon, at present in the said Rural Deanery of Reigate, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Caterham; and each of the said Parishes shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery and of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry in which it is hereby included and to which it is hereby transferred and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or Archdeaconry, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or of any other Archdeacon.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them under or by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas notices of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act been transmitted to the Archdeacons affected by the Scheme, that is to say, to the Archdeacon of Kingston-upon-Thames, to the Archdeacon of Lewisham, and to the Archdeacon of Southwark, and they have severally expressed their approval of the same:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the

Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 17th day of January, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint John, Drypool, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

“Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 17th day of July, 1917, and published in the London Gazette on the 20th day of the same month, a separate District for spiritual purposes was constituted out of the Parish of Drypool in the said County and Diocese, and the said District was named ‘The District of Saint John, Drypool’:

“And whereas the said District of Saint John, Drypool, has become a New Parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John, Drypool, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that, from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John, Drypool, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said Parish of Drypool which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dis severed from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint John, Drypool.

“And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.
