

consideration of the sum of £200 the said Editha Devereux Henderson did thereby convey unto the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Little Blakenham with Nettlestead, to hold the same unto the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and his successors in fee simple:

"And whereas the said conveyance was made with the intention of vesting the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage or presentation in the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, in right of his See, and the parties thereto are desirous that anything which by way of further assurance or otherwise may be required effectually to carry out that intention may be done and have applied to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that a scheme under the Acts hereinbefore mentioned may be prepared for the said purpose and submitted to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the said Editha Devereux Henderson and Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, are consenting to this Scheme, the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, both as party to the said conveyance of the 17th day of November, 1934, and as Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, the Diocese wherein the said Benefice of Little Blakenham with Nettlestead is situate, approving of and accepting the transfer of the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage or presentation, as required by the Acts before mentioned or some or one of them:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Little Blakenham with Nettlestead which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Little Blakenham and Nettlestead:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Editha Devereux Henderson (in testimony whereof she has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Little Blakenham with Nettlestead shall be transferred to the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 18th day of October, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for the taking down and the appropriation or sale of the site and materials of the Church of Saint Gabriel, situate in the Parish of Newington, Saint Mary, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark:

"Whereas the said Church of Saint Gabriel was consecrated on the 9th day of May, 1874, and is a Chapel of Ease to the Parish Church of the said Parish of Newington, Saint Mary:

"And whereas the said Church of Saint Gabriel has ceased to be used and is no longer required for the purposes of Divine Service:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard Godfrey, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), and with the consent of the Reverend William Houghton Hacksley, now Incumbent of the Benefice of Newington, Saint Mary (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1.—(a) That the said Church of Saint Gabriel shall be taken down and the site and materials thereof shall be appropriated or sold by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects and subject to such conditions as
