

mission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

In Section A candidates take all subjects; in Section B the candidate may offer subjects up to a maximum mark of 600, provided that not more than four of the subjects numbered 11 to 16, or more than two of the subjects numbered 17 to 23, or more than two of the subjects numbered 29 to 33 may be offered.

A candidate desiring to offer any of the subjects 30 to 33 must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of laboratory training in an institution of university rank. For Geography, other equivalent training will be required.

6. Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole, apart from the viva voce marks, as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. Candidates whose handwriting is not easily legible will suffer a deduction of marks on that account.

8. When vacancies are offered for competition under more than one Department, candidates will be allowed to choose, according to their place on the list, between the several classes of vacancy available.

9. Applications for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

10. A fee of £2 will be required from every applicant for permission to attend an Examination; this fee is not returnable in any circumstances. A further fee of £4, being the balance of the prescribed fee of £6, will be required from every candidate attending such Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held in London under the foregoing Regulations, the written work commencing on the 2nd July, 1935.

Not fewer than 20 vacancies for Assistant Inspectors of Taxes and 10 vacancies for Third Class Officers will be filled on the result of this examination, if so many candidates should be found to be qualified in all respects.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 2nd May, 1935, an application in the candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1934.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport under and by virtue of the provisions of paragraph (b) of sub-section (4) of Section 1 of the Road Traffic Act, 1934, intends to make an Order the effect of which will be

(1) that there will be no speed limit under that Section in respect of any road or length of road specified in the First Schedule hereto;

(2) that the speed limit under the said Section will apply throughout the length of every road or length of road specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

Chertsey Arterial Road (A.316) from Kew Road to its western end.

Great West Road (A.4) from Chiswick High Road to Bath Road.

Great South-West Road (A.30) from Bath Road to Staines Road, Bedfont.

Bath Road and Colnbrook By-Pass (A.4) from Great West Road to the eastern end of the Slough Urban District.

Western Avenue (A.403) from Wood Lane to its western end.

Greenford Road (A.4127) from Uxbridge Road to Sudbury Hill/Harrow Road.
