COUNTY BOROUGH OF SOUTHAMPTON.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, application has been made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Southampton (hereinafter called "the Corporation")

to the Traffic Commissioners for the South-Eastern Area for consent to the running by the Corporation of Public Service Vehicles on Roads within that Traffic Area and outside the County Borough of Southampton, that is to say:—

(a) Mousehole Lane in the County of Southampton in the Parish of Millbrook, commencing in Mousehole Lane for a distance of approximately 100 yards to the Borough Isolation Hospital and in the opposite direction over the same route.

(b) Commencing in Bursledon Road at the Borough Boundary in the County of Southampton in the Parish of Bursledon, for a distance of approximately two miles to a point near the "Red Lion" Hotel situated approximately 250 yards beyond Bursledon Bridge and in the opposite direction over the same route.

And notice is hereby further given that objection by any Local Authority, County Council or persons (if any) already providing similar transport facilities on or in the neighbourhood of the above mentioned routes, may be sent in writing to the Traffic Commissioners of the South-Eastern Traffic Area at their Offices at Gaywood House, Wood Street, London, S.W.1, before the 9th March, 1935.

A copy of any such objection should at the same time be sent by the objector to the Town Clerk, Civic Centre, Southampton.
