TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO MAKE A SPECIAL ORDER TO BE CITED AS THE TRADE BOARDS (TOY MANUFACTURING) ORDER, 1935.

The Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that, with a view to altering the description of the Toy Manufacturing Trade contained in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920, as varied by the Trade Boards (Toy Manufacturing) Order, 1926, he intends, pursuant to the powers conferred upon him by Section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order varying the Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920, as varied by the Trade Boards (Toy Manufacturing) Order, 1926.

Copies of the draft Special Order may be obtained on application in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Labour, Whitehall, London, S.W.1.

Objections to the draft Special Order must be sent so as to reach the Minister of Labour at the above address within forty-two days from the first day of March, 1935, that is to

say on or before the twelfth day of April, 1935. Every objection must be in writing and must state—

- (a) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

The Secretary for Mines, has appointed Mr. Henry Shepherd Stephenson to be a Junior Inspector of Mines under the Coal Mines Acts, 1887 to 1919, and has instructed him to act also as an Inspector for the purposes of the Metalliferous Mines Regulation Acts, 1872 and 1875, and of the Quarries Act, 1894.

Under the provisions of the Mining Industry Act, 1920, and of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, the Secretary for Mines has further appointed Mr. Stephenson to be an Inspector of Factories and Workshops for the purposes of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, so far as it applies to quarries and pitbanks as defined in Part II of the Sixth Schedule to that Act.
