MILK ACT, 1934.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, have certified the cheese-milk price for the month of March, 1935, as required by Sub-section 2 of Section 4 of the Milk Act, 1934, in the following terms:—

Certification of Cheese-Milk Price.

Whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 4 of the Milk Act, 1934 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is provided that for the purposes of the Act the cheese-milk price for any month shall be the excess over one penny three
