or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, Lord Bishop of Carlisle, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Lord Archbishop of York, in the following terms:—

"That there is in the County of Cumberland and in my Diocese of Carlisle the Rectory of Harrington the Parish whereof adjoins the Rectory of Moresby.

"That there is also within the said County and Diocese the Rectory of Moresby the Parish whereof adjoins the said Parish of Harrington as the same respectively appear on the Plan which accompanies this Representation.

"That the said Parish of Harrington and the said Parish of Moresby have each of them a sufficiently commodious Church within their

respective limits.

"That a District (part of the said Parish of Harrington) adjoining to the said Parish of Moresby as the same is shown on the said Plan and hereinafter particularly described is situated considerably nearer to the Church of Moresby than to the Church of Harrington and it would be more convenient for the Inhabitants of the said portion to attend Divine Service at the Church of Moresby than to attend at the Church of Harrington.

"That according to the last Census the population of the said Parish of Harrington is four thousand three hundred and seventy one persons and the population of the said Parish of Moresby is two thousand seven hundred and thirty five persons and the population of the said District part of the said Parish of Harrington referred to in the last paragraph is

eight hundred and fifteen.

"That the Patronage of the said Rectory of Harrington belongs to Isabel Mary Chance the wife of Frederick Selby Chance of Home Acres Carlisle in the said County Esquire and the Reverend James Reginald Wilkinson, Clerk, is the Rector of the said Rectory of Harrington and the Patronage of the said Rectory of Moresby belongs to the Earl of Lonsdale and the Reverend Arthur William Johnston is the Rector of the said Rectory of Moresby all of whom are consenting parties to the separation and annexation hereinafter proposed.

"That it appears to me that the said District part of the said Parish of Harrington adjoining the Parish of Moresby as before stated may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament of the First and Second years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, and the Second and Third years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 49, be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Harrington and be united with the said Parish of Moresby for all ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said first mentioned Act of Parliament I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may best be effected with justice to all parties and I do submit the same to Your Grace to the intent that Your Grace if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied of the said Scheme may certify the same and such consent to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"1. It is proposed to separate from the Parish of Harrington to which it now belongs and to add to the Parish of Moresby such District a portion of the Parish of Harrington as hereinafter described (that is to say) so much of the Parish of Harrington as is coloured pink on the said Plan with a line commencing at the low water mark immediately due West of the point marked 'Old Level (Coal)' on the said Plan immediately North of the Micklam Brick Works; to follow the Brickworks Road to its junction with the Highway at the Harrington Urban District Council Water Tank; to follow the Highway North-East to the point where the side-road leading to Lowca Heights diverges from the Highway; to follow this side-road to a point opposite the Beck which runs to the South of the Corn Mill adjoining the boundary of the Parish of Distington; to follow the line of the Beck to a point immediately South of the said Corn Mill to the boundary of the said Parish of Distington; and to follow the boundary of the said Parish of Distington until it meets the present boundary of Moresby Parish at the junction of Middlegill Beck with Lowca Beck.

"2. That the said District shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said Parish of Moresby and the Rectory of the last mentioned Parish shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same.

"3. That all fees and payments arising from churchings marriages and burials and for all such other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed in respect of the said District and all such other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Parish or Benefice as shall arise within or in respect of the said District shall henceforth belong to and be received by the Incumbent of the said Parish of Moresby but no
