#### NEEDLES, ETC., AND FISHING TACKLE.

With reference to the notice which was published in the London and Edinburgh Gazettes of the 9th November, 1934, and the Belfast Gazette of the 16th November, 1934, regarding a reference made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, in respect of the following descriptions of imported goods:—

1. Hand sewing needles.  
Machine needles and hooks.  
Gramophone needles of metal.  
Bodkins and stiletos for industrial purposes.  
Crochet hooks.  
Knitting needles and pins.
