## RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that he proposes after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 10 of the aforesaid London Traffic Act to make the London Traffic (Restriction of through traffic) Regulations, 1935, with a view to prohibiting mechanically-propelled vehicles from entering any of the undermentioned streets except for the purpose of proceeding to premises in such streets:

The Electricity Commissioners further approve of the means provided for fixing meters of this description, and for connecting them with the service lines as described in the specification and drawings above referred to.
