FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1935 (No. 25).

SUBJECT.

Declares the area described in the Schedule to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising:—

In the county of Lancaster.

The cities and county boroughs of Manchester (excluding the former parishes of Baguley and Northern Etchells) and Salford.

The county boroughs of Blackburn, Bolton, Burnley, Bury, Oldham and Rochdale.

The boroughs of Accrington, Ashton-under-Lyne, Bacup, Darwen, Eccles, Haslingden, Heywood, Middleton, Mossley, Nelson, Rawtenstall and Stretford.

The petty sessional divisions of Church, Burnley (except the parish of Sabden), Darwen, including its detached part, Bolton, including its detached part (except the parish of Blackrod), Bury, Middleton, Oldham, Ashton-under-Lyne and Manchester, including its detached part (except the parish of Irlam).

The parishes of Old Laund Booth, Wheatley Carr Booth, Brierfield, Great Harwood, Rish-ton, Livesey, Tyldesley, Atherton and so much of the parish of Oswaldthistle as lies within the petty sessional division of Blackburn.

The borough of Todmorden.

The petty sessional divisions of Todmorden, West Morley (except the parishes of Southowram, Elland and Fisby), and Saddleworth.

The parishes of Scammonden, Golcar, Slaithwaite, Linthwaite, Marsden and Meltham.

The boroughs of Dukinfield, Hyde and Stalybridge

The petty sessional division of Dukinfield.

The parishes of Ashton-upon-Mersey, Sale, Bredbury, Romiley and Compstall.
