

junction with Newearth Road thence proceeding in a north-easterly and northerly direction along the boundary between the urban districts of Little Hulton and Worsley as existing prior to the making of the Lancashire (Manchester and District) Review Order 1933 to the site of a disused mineral railway thence along the site of that railway to the boundary of the urban district of Tyldesley at a point near the southern corner of the Inclosure numbered 217 on the <sup>2505</sup> Ordnance Map Lancashire Sheet XCV.14 (Edition of 1928).

and to repeal or revoke the powers of the Council in relation to the supply of gas in any other areas.

2. To empower the Council to purchase take and hold retain sell lease exchange or otherwise dispose of lands for the purpose of the gas undertaking of the Council.

3. General provisions as to the conduct of the gas undertaking of the Council including the supply and purchase of gas in bulk, the laying of pipes in private streets, the provision of dwelling houses offices and show-rooms, notice of discontinuance of the supply of gas, inspection and testing of meters, position of meters, prevention of improper use of gas, fittings not to be subject to distress, relief from obligation to supply, power to compel repairs in case of danger, use of moneys forming part of sinking and other funds, service of gas demand notes, alternative provisions in regard to the service of Notices upon consumers, the recovery of sums due for fittings and the exemption of the Council and their officers from personal liability.

4. To provide that all moneys received by the Council in connection with their gas undertaking whether on capital or revenue account shall be carried to and form part of the general rate fund of the urban district of Tyldesley and that all payments and expenses made and incurred by the Council in respect of the said undertaking shall be paid or transferred out of the said general rate fund.

5. To make provision in regard to the form and nature of the accounts of the said undertaking to be kept by the Council.

6. To provide as to the method by which and the purposes for which the surplus revenue of the said undertaking shall be expended and applied by the Council, and amongst other things to permit of the formation of a reserve fund in connection with the said undertaking to be invested or to be applied in making good any deficiency charged to the said general rate fund, in meeting any extraordinary claims or demand in respect of the said undertaking or in or towards the payment of the cost of renewing improving or extending any works forming part of the said undertaking or otherwise for the benefit thereof.

7. To make special provision for the regulation of the charges to be made for gas supplied by the Council by reference to the amount of the surplus gas revenue and the moneys for the time being remaining in the reserve fund referred to in paragraph 6 of this Notice, and in particular if the said reserve fund amounts to more than one twentieth of the aggregate capital expended for the time being on the gas undertaking of the Council to provide that the Council shall fix such amount as they think

fit (not being less in any case in which the excess of revenue over expenditure is more than a sum equal to one and a half per centum of the outstanding debt of the gas undertaking than the difference between that sum and the said excess) and shall reduce the charges for gas supplied by such amount or respective amounts as will as nearly as practicable be equivalent in the aggregate to the amount so fixed by the Council.

8. To repeal alter or amend or to re-enact or to incorporate in the Order with or without amendment some or all of the provisions of the Acts and Orders relating to the supply of gas by the Council and in particular such of the provisions of the Tyldesley with Shakerley Local Board (Gas) Act 1865, the Tyldesley with Shakerley Orders 1878, 1886 and 1906 and the Tyldesley with Shakerley Gas (Charges) Order 1930 as relate to the Council's limits of supply, the application of the revenue of the gas undertaking of the Council, the keeping of accounts and other financial matters.

Any local or other public authority company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 29th day of July, 1935.

Any such objection shall state—

- (a) the specific grounds of objection and
- (b) the omissions additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the Objection must be forwarded to the Council or the undersigned Clerk of the Council or Parliamentary Agents at the same time as it is sent to the Board of Trade.

Printed copies of the draft Order and maps showing the boundaries of the proposed area of supply and of the area in which the Council are already authorised to supply gas (except so far as the powers of supply are sought to be repealed by the proposed Order) have been deposited for public inspection at the Town Hall, Tyldesley, Lancashire, and at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the County Palatine of Lancaster at Preston.

THE GOOLE GAS (CHARGES) ORDER, 1929.
