**BIDEFORD AND DISTRICT
ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION).**

NOTICE is hereby given that the Bideford and District Electric Supply Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") whose registered office is situate at 6, The Quay, Bideford, in the County of Devon, have applied to the Electricity Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1935, for a Special Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

To extend the area for the supply of electrical energy by the Company so as to enable them to provide and distribute electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1935, within the parishes of Arlington, Ashford, Bratton Fleming, Braunton, Challacombe, East Down, Goodleigh, Heanton Punchardon, High Bray, Kentisbury, Loxhore, Martinhoe, Marwood, Parracombe, Shirwell, Stoke Rivers, Trentishoe and West Pilton in the rural district of Barnstaple in the county of Devon (hereinafter referred to as "the added area").

To authorise the Company to exercise within the added area all powers usually conferred on distributors of electrical energy.

To authorise the Company to break up certain streets and parts of streets not repairable by the local authority and railways within the added area.

To make provision as to the maximum prices which may be charged by the Company for electricity within the added area.

To empower the Company to purchase and the Braunton Electric Light and Power Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Braunton Company") to sell the undertaking of the Braunton Company authorised by the Braunton and District Electricity Special Order, 1929, and the rights powers authorities privileges obligations and liabilities of the Braunton Company as undertakers under and in respect of the said Order.

To apply to the added area with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Bideford and District Electricity Orders, 1925 to 1933.

**HEREFORDSHIRE JOINT PLANNING
SCHEME.**

NOTICE is hereby given that:—1. On the 17th day of June, 1935, the Minister of Health notified his approval of the Resolution of the Herefordshire Joint Planning Committee dated the 6th day of February, 1935, deciding to prepare the above Planning Scheme with reference to an area comprising the whole of the areas of the Borough of Leominster, the Urban Districts of Bromyard, Kington, Ledbury and Ross-on-Wye, and the Rural Districts of Dore and Bredwardine, Bromyard, Hereford, Kington, Ledbury, Leominster and Wigmore, Ross and Whitchurch, and Weobley. 2. The Map defining the area to which the Resolution applies, has been deposited at the Shirehall, Hereford, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested, without charge, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any week-day. 3. Any person who is, or claims to be, an owner of any property in the area, and any Association representing owners of property within the Borough of Leominster, the Urban Districts of Bromyard, Kington, Ledbury, and Ross-on-Wye, and the Rural Districts of Dore and Bredwardine, Bromyard, Hereford, Kington, Ledbury, Leominster and Wigmore, Ross and Whitchurch, and Weobley, and any local Association representing business or industry, may, by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the Herefordshire Joint Planning Committee to register, without charge, his or their names and addresses for the service of subsequent notices relating to the Scheme.

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order 1933* the development of land in the area during the preparation of the Scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order and in addition the Leominster Borough Council and the Urban District Councils of Bromyard, Kington, Ledbury and Ross-on-Wye, and the
