and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Sissons Row for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Number 14 and Number 9 Sissons Row, and extending thence northwestward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the said house and premises known as Number 9 Sissons Row, and extending thence south-westward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 12 yards or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence which divides the close numbered 117 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Middleton published in the year 1931 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 118 upon the said maps, and extending thence first westward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 117 and the closes numbered 137, 138, 139 and 149 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 118 and the closes numbered 136, 135 and 140 upon the same maps for a distance of 2012 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 149 from the said close numbered 140 crosses the middle of the footpath leading to Mill Farm, and extending thence first south-westward, then westward and then north-westward along the middle of the said footpath (thereby passing under the Beeston and Batley Branch Line and also under the Main Line of the London and North Eastern Railway) for a distance of 264 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Mill Shaw Beck, and extending thence westward in a straight line for a distance of 3 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Mill Shaw Beck upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Middleton (in Rothwell) from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Townend, Morley."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 27th day of June, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Paul situate at Yelverton in the Parish of Buckland Monachorum, in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Paul, situate at Yelverton as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Lord William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Buckland Monachorum which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Paul, situate at Yelverton, as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Yelverton.'

"And with the like consent of the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter the said (testified as aforesaid), we, Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Paul, situate at Yelverton, as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend Bennett Guyon Leonard-Williams, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicar-age of the said Parish of Buckland Monachorum, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said Church of Saint Paul, Yelverton, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said Bennett Guyon Leonard-Williams.
