

Parish of Buckland Monachorum, in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say:—upon a small part of the west by the Parish of Tamerton Foliot, upon the south-east by the Parish of Bickleigh, upon the east by the Parish of Meavy, upon the north partly by the Parish of Walkhampton and partly by the New Parish of Horrabridge, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining part of the west by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Horrabridge from the said Parish of Buckland Monachorum crosses the middle of the road leading from Horrabridge through Axtown to Plymouth, and extending thence southward along the middle of such road for a distance of 1 mile and 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction at Roborough Rock with the road leading to Miltoncombe, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 1064 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Buckland Monachorum published in the year 1906 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Representation, and extending thence first south-eastward to such fence and then first south-eastward and then in various directions along the fences forming the western boundaries of the said close numbered 1064 and of the closes numbered 1065, 1031 and 1031A, the western and southern boundaries of the close numbered 1028A and the western boundary of the close numbered 1028 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 33½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the western boundary of the said close numbered 1028 reaches the western side of the old turnpike road leading to Plymouth, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then southward along the middle of the said old turnpike road for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the main road from Tavistock to Plymouth, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said main road for a distance of 1 mile and 55 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Buckland Monachorum from the said Parish of Tamerton Foliot.”

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

“We William Lord Bishop of Exeter in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

“There is in the County of Devon and Diocese of Exeter the Benefice or Rectory of Saint Edmund Exeter the Parish whereof contains a population of 751 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 250 persons. The net annual value of the Benefice of Saint Edmund Exeter is Three hundred and thirty-one pounds or thereabouts.

“There is also in the same County and Diocese the Benefice or Vicarage of Saint Thomas Exeter the Parish whereof contains a population of 10,687 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 750 persons. The net annual value of the Benefice of Saint Thomas Exeter is Four hundred and fifty-five pounds or thereabouts.

“That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, a portion of the Parish of Saint Thomas Exeter (the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme annexed to this Representation and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto edged with blue) may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Saint Edmund Exeter to which it is contiguous.

“The Patrons of the Benefice of Saint Edmund Exeter are Toc H Incorporated and the Reverend Frank Oswald Urwin is the Incumbent thereof.

“The Patron of the Benefice of Saint Thomas Exeter is the Right Reverend The Lord Bishop of Exeter and the Reverend Gordon Basil Nicholls is the Incumbent thereof.

“That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes, rentcharges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council.”
