NORTH-EAST CHESHIRE REGIONAL PLANNING SCHEME.

MOTTRAM-IN-LONGDENDALE URBAN DISTRICT PLANNING SCHEME.

NOTICE is hereby given that (1) on the first day of August, 1935, the Minister of Health notified his approval of the resolution of the Mottram-in-Longdendale Urban District Council dated the seventeenth day of May, 1935, deciding to prepare the above town planning scheme with reference to an area situate within the Urban District of Mottram-in-Longdendale; (2) the Map defining the area to which the resolution applies has been deposited at the Council Offices, 4, Broad-bottom Road, Mottram, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without charge from Monday to Friday between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. and on Saturdays between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon; (3) any person who is, or claims to be, an owner of any property in the area and any association representing owners of property within

the said Urban District of Mottram-in-Longdendale, and any local association representing business or industry may, by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the North-East Cheshire Regional Planning Committee (to which Committee the Mottram-in-Longdendale Urban District Council have delegated all their powers under the Town and Country Planning Act, 1932) to register without charge his or their name and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the scheme.

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933, the development of land in the area during the preparation of the scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order and in addition the Mottram-in-Longdendale Urban District Council are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period, with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited together with the aforesaid Map.

The North-East Cheshire Regional Planning Committee intend to proceed as soon as may be with the preparation of a Draft Scheme and any suggestions as to the proposals to be included in the Draft Scheme should be sent in writing to the Clerk of the North-East Cheshire Regional Planning Committee.
