At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 13th day of *August*, 1935.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 11th day of July, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, the New Parish of St. Barnabas, Gillingham, and the New Parish of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, all in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester :

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 12th day of September, 1863, and published in the London Gazette on the 15th day of the same month, part of the Parish of Gillingham in the said County and Diocese, was constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and the said District was named ‘ The District of Saint Mark, New Brompton ’ :

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 9th day of May, 1892, and published in the London Gazette on the 13th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named ‘ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham ’ :

“ And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 16th day of February, 1917, and published in the London Gazette on the 20th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named ‘ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Gillingham ’ :

“ And whereas the said District of Saint Mark, New Brompton, the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, have become New
