**T**He Galeons are not yet permitted to Unlade by reason the Indulto which the Merchants are to pay for their Effects on Board them, is not yet agreed on. In the mean while the President of the Contractation, has, by Order from Court, caused 590000 Pieces of Eight to be taken out of the Galeons for the King's use, and 200000 Pieces of Eight more are Demanded for the Charges of the Galeons; whereupon the Merchants, who think themselves over-charged, have resolved to send Deputies to Madrid, to represent these Matters to the King. The Admiral and Vice-Admiral, with another Ship of the Flota designed for *New Spain*, sailed hence the 24th instant; and two Ships more with Stores will shortly be sent to *Cartagena*. The *Ann Galley* came in here the 15th instant from *Alicant*, and the *Concord*, Captain *Richard Young* from *Turkey*, the last of which sailed on the 23th for *London*. The 16th came in the *Drake Galley*, Capt. *Marrin*, from *Falmouth*, who sailed the 20th for *Turkey*, as did likewise the *Susannah Galley* which was in this Harbour, for *Genoux* and *Leborne*. The *Pool Man of War*, Capt. *Cranby* Commander, put into this Port the 18th instant. The 17th came in 2 French Men of War, and on the 18th they failed again to Cruise on the Coast of *Sally*. On the 24th arrived here the *Robert Bonaventure*, Captain *Tisdale* from *Norway*, which sailed the 26th for *Venice*.

*Malaga*, July 29. The *Eagle Galley*, Captain *Underwood* Commander, failed from hence the 21th instant; as did also several Merchantmen belonging to *Hambour* and *Venice*. The 22th came in here the *Susannah* and the *Drake Gallies*, bound to *Smirna* and *Scanderoc*; And the 24th put into this Port, the *Naples Galley*, Captain *Marsjell* Commander, bound home from *Naples*. The 27th, the *Content*, a French Man of War, came in from *Cruising*, and failed again the same day, as did also another French Man of War which lay at Anchor about a League off this Port.

*Madrid*, August 6. There has been for this last fortnight no considerable alteration in the State of the King of *Spain's* Health; and His Majesty goes abroad every evening to take the Air, and appears in the most publick Places. We have an Account from *Barcelona*, That the Prince of *Hesse Darmstadt*, with several other General Officers, went from thence on the 24th of the last month, to visit the Frontier Places of *Catalonia*. The *Marquis de Leganes*, late Governor of *Milán*, is arrived at *Bavcelona* from *Italy*. The 14 French Gallies which have lately been upon the Spanish Coasts, appeared the 23th past off *Barcelona*, taking their Course Eastward.

*Warsaw*, Aug. 11. The Emperor's Envoy and the Pope's Nuntio, with several Senators and other Persons of Quality are lately gone from hence to attend the King of *Poland*, who continues his Journey to the Frontiers, where the Army is drawing together; and 'tis generally said, the King will put in execution some great design this Campaign.

We have received Advice, That the Czar is coming this way from *Vienna*, and intends to meet the King of *Poland* at *Lemberg* in order to Confer and enter into joint Measures with him for carrying on the War against the Turks. The Rebellion lately raised in the Czars Dominions is suppressed, and the principal Authors of it exemplarily punished.

*Vienna*, August 13. The *Marquis de Villars*, Envoy Extraordinary from *France*, has had a private Audience of the Emperor. The *Muscovite Ambassador*, who was left here, designs in a few days to take his Audience of Leave, and to follow the Czar his Master to *Muscovy*, who according to our last Letters from *Poland*, was come to *Wielecza* near *Cracow*. The Advices from *Hungary* of the 5th instant, say, Prince *Eugene* of *Saroy* arrived the 2d in the Imperial Camp near *Caloush*, where he found all the Foot, and the greatest part of the Horse drawn together, with the Artillery. The 3d he took a Review of the Army, which marched on the 4th to *Samber*, and the next day would continue their march to *Peter Waradin*. We hear the Grand Visier with the Ottoman Army under his Command, consisting in between 60 and 70000 men, is come beyond *Nissa*, and marches towards *Belgrade* with all possible diligence. However, we are assured, That the Negotiation for a Peace is in great forwardness, and will in all appearance be concluded this Summer.

*Frankfort*, Aug. 20. The Elector *Palatine's* Guards passed yesterday through this City going to *Weynsheim*, where we hear his Electoral Highness arrived last night. The Count of *Sintzenborff* is also arrived there with the Character of Envoy from his Imperial Majesty. The French design to build a strong Fortrefs over-against *Brisac*, and will begin that work in a short time.

*Brussels*, Aug. 24. The Conferences at this Court about Regulating the Forces to be kept on Foot in the *Spanish Netherlands* in time of Peace, are continued; and the States of the several Provinces have sent Deputies hither to make their Representations thereupon, who have had Audience of the Elector of *Bavaria*; and the States of *Brabant* are assembled to consider of the same Business.

*Loo*, Aug. 25. On the 23th Count *Tallard* the French Ambassador, came hither from *Utrecht* to wait on His Majesty, and returned this morning. His Majesty went this day to *Dieren*, and intends to continue there some days.

*Hague*, Aug. 26. Count *Tallard* arrived here this afternoon from *Utrecht*: Prince *Gaston*, second Son to the Duke of *Tuscany* is daily expected. The Prince of *Nassau Saarbruck*, who came hither lately from *Loo*, intends to go this week to his Government of *Boisleduc*. Monsieur *Dyckvelt* is gone to *Brussels* to Confer with the Elector of *Bavaria*. The Prince of *Steenhuysen* is expected at this place to morrow from *Germany*, and will go to wait on His Majesty at *Loo*. There are yet no Orders given for the Dutch Troops to march to the Camp, which was said to be intended on the

*Mookerheyde* near *Nimeguen* this Summer; and 'tis now doubted whether there will be any.

*Paris, Aug. 27.* The King goes to-morrow to *Chantilly*, where he will stay 2 or 3 days, and then continue his Journey to *Compiègne*, towards which place his Guards marched yesterday. It's said, after that Encampment is over, the Court will come to *Fontainebleau*, and that the Ceremony of the Duke of *Lorraine's* Marriage with *Made-moiselle*, Daughter to the Duke of *Orleans*, will be performed there by Proxy the 2d of *October*, and on the 7th, that Princes will go from thence for *Lorraine*. Monsieur *Hecskirke* and Monsieur *Odyke*, Ambassadors from the *States General* of the *United Provinces*, made their publick Entry here on the 24th instant, being received by the *Mareschal de Tourville*, and Monsieur de *Saintor*: Introduc-tor of Ambassadors, and conducted with a great Train of Coaches to the House for the Entertainment of Ambassadors, in the usual manner; and yesterday they had their publick Audience of the King at *Verfailles*, and afterwards of the Dauphin, the Duke and Dutchess of *Burgundy*, and of the Dukes of *Anjou* and *Berry*, with the accustomed Ceremonies. Yesterday in the afternoon the Court went to *St. Cloud*, where the Duke de *Chartres's* Daughter was Christned, the Dauphin being Godfather, and the Dutchess of *Burgundy* Godmother. The Prince of *Parma*, who is Travelling, is come hither from *Holland*, and designs to be at the Camp at *Compeigne*. We hear from *Cadiz*, That the French Men of War which put into that Port some time ago, are Cruising on the Coast of *Barbary*; and that about 20 of the Men on Board one of them, being gone ashore near *Tangier*, a Party of the Moors fell upon them and took them all Prisoners except two, who made their Escape with much difficulty, and returned on Board their Ship.

*Calais, Aug. 29.* The Earl of *Jersey*, His Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary to the Most Christian King, having Embarked at *Dover* last Wednesday in the evening, arrived here yesterday in the afternoon. His Excellency was Saluted with a Discharge of the Guns from the Fort and Citadel, and at his landing, the Governor, with several other Gentlemen received his Excellency, and conducted him to his House: The whole Garison were drawn up in Arms, and placed from the Town-Gate to the Governor's House, where his Excellency was very splendidly Entertained; and this afternoon his Excellency intends to go hence for *Paris*.

*Maderas, June 30.* O. S. The Honourable Mr. *Grey*, Governor of the *Barbadoes*, arrived here the 24th instant on Board His Majesty's Ship the *Soldadoes Prize*, and having been entertained by the Governor with much Civility, intends to Sail again to-morrow, together with the rest of the Ships that are with him, in order to pursue their Voyage.

*Dublin, Aug. 15.* The Lords-Justices of this Kingdom design to go hence to-morrow to *Lurgan-Race*, to view 3 Regiments of Foot, one of Horse, and one of Dragoons, which are encamped near that place. Brigadier *Fairfax's* Regiment arrived here on Thursday last from *Chester*. His Grace the Duke of *Ormond* went hence last Saturday to *Kilkenny*.

*Portsmouth, Aug. 19.* Vice-Admiral *Aylmer*, who commands the Squadron bound to the *Seynights*, arrived here yesterday, and went on Board His Majesty's Ship the *Boync*, and hoisted the Red Flag at the Fore-top mast Head.
