A PROCLAMATION

FOR DISSOLVING THE PRESENT PARLIAMENT, AND DECLARING THE CALLING OF ANOTHER.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to dissolve this present Parliament which stands prorogued to Tuesday, the Nineteenth day of November next; We do, for that End, publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby dissolve the said Parliament accordingly: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are discharged from their Meeting and Attendance on the said Tuesday, the Nineteenth day of November next: And We being desirous and resolved, as soon as may be, to meet Our People, and to have their Advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all Our loving Subjects Our

Royal Will and Pleasure to call a new Parliament: And do hereby further declare, that, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, We have given Order that Our Chancellor of Great Britain and Our Governor of Northern Ireland do respectively, upon Notice thereof, forthwith issue out Writs, in due Form and according to Law, for calling a new Parliament: And We do hereby also, by this Our Royal Proclamation under Our Great Seal of Our Realm, require Writs forthwith to be issued accordingly by Our said Chancellor and Governor respectively, for causing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons who are to serve in the said Parliament to be duly returned to, and give their Attendance in, Our said Parliament on Tuesday the Twenty-sixth day of November next, which Writs are to be returnable in due course of Law.

A PROCLAMATION

IN ORDER TO THE ELECTING AND SUMMONING THE SIXTEEN PEERS OF SCOTLAND.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS We have in our Council thought fit to declare Our pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and

Northern Ireland, on Tuesday, the Twenty-sixth day of November next ensuing the date hereof: In order, therefore, to the electing and summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parliament, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at the Palace of Holyroodhouse, in Edinburgh, on Friday the Fifteenth day of November next at Twelve o'clock Noon, to nominate and choose the Sixteen Peers to sit and vote in the House of Peers in the said ensuing Parliament by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent (such Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly signed before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law); and the Lord Clerk Register, or in the event of a vacancy in the Office of Lord Clerk Register or in his absence from any cause, the Principal Clerk of the Session, or in the event of a vacancy in that Office or in his absence from any cause, such person as may be designated for the purpose by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, is hereby required to attend such Meeting, and to take the Votes of the said Peers, and immediately after such Election made and duly examined to certify the Names of the Sixteen Peers so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the Electors, and return such Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: And We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly command and require the Lord Provost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said City, to take especial care to preserve the Peace thereof during the time of the said Election, and to prevent all manner of Riots, Tumults, Disorders, and Violence whatsoever: And We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns of Scotland, Ten Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such Election.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, it is provided that His Majesty may make such Orders in Council and do such things as appear to him to be necessary for carrying out the Treaty of Peace signed at Versailles on the twenty-eighth day of June, nineteen hundred and nineteen, and for giving effect to any of the provisions of the said Treaty:

And whereas it is also provided by the said Act that any Order in Council made thereunder may provide for the imposition by summary process or otherwise of penalties in respect of breaches of the provisions thereof:

And whereas it is expedient for the purpose of carrying out the said Treaty, and for giving effect to the Covenant of the League of Nations contained in Part I thereof, to make the provisions hereinafter contained:

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance or other lawful means His Majesty has power and jurisdiction in British protectorates and territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty, and is pleased by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise to extend the provisions of this Order to all such protectorates and to territories in respect of which such a mandate as aforesaid is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of his Privy Council is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Prohibition of certain exports to Italy.

1.—(1) On and after the date of the making of this Order, no goods of any of the descriptions set out in Part I of the Schedule to this Order shall be exported to Italian territory from a port or place in the United Kingdom, and, on and after such date as the Board of Trade may by order appoint, no goods of any of the descriptions set out in Part II of that Schedule shall be exported as aforesaid:

Provided that, subject to such conditions as the Commissioners may impose for securing that the provisions of this paragraph are not evaded, this paragraph shall not apply to goods of any of the descriptions set out in the said Part II which are exported after transit through the United Kingdom or by way of transhipment.

(2) No goods which are for the time being prohibited to be exported as aforesaid shall, at any port or place in the United Kingdom, be shipped or delivered as stores on a vessel or aircraft proceeding to Italian territory, unless the Commissioners are satisfied that the goods are required for use or consumption on that vessel or aircraft.

(3) Section one hundred and thirty-nine of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, shall have effect as if the reference therein to goods intended for exportation included a reference to goods intended for shipment or delivery as stores, and section eleven of the Finance Act, 1914 (Session 2), as amended by section nineteen of the Finance Act, 1921, shall have effect accordingly.

(4) The exporter of any goods which, at the time of the exportation thereof, were prohibited by this Article to be exported to Italian territory, shall, if required by the Commissioners, produce evidence to their satisfaction that the goods have not reached Italian territory, and, if the exporter fails to do so, he shall be liable to a customs penalty of treble the value of the goods or one hundred pounds at the election of the Commissioners unless he proves that he did not consent to or connive at the goods reaching such territory and took all reasonable steps to secure that the final destination of the goods was that specified in the customs documents relating to the shipment thereof.

(5) If the Commissioners have reason to suspect that any declaration made in the course of making entry before shipment by a person about to export goods of any description set out in the Schedule to this Order is untrue in any material particular, the goods may be detained until the Commissioners are satisfied as

to the truth of the declaration and, failing such satisfaction, the goods shall be forfeited.

(6) The provisions of this Article shall be in addition to and not in derogation of the provisions of section eight of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by any other enactment, of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and of any Proclamation or Order in Council made under the said enactments.

Prohibition of Italian imports.

2.—(1) On and after such date as the Board of Trade may by order appoint, no goods consigned from, or grown, produced or manufactured in, Italian territory shall be imported into the United Kingdom, except gold or silver bullion or coin:

Provided that, subject to such conditions as the Commissioners may impose for securing that the provisions of this paragraph are not evaded, this paragraph shall not apply—

(a) to goods which had before the date aforesaid left the place from which they were last consigned; or

(b) to goods imported for exportation after transit through the United Kingdom or by way of transhipment.

(2) Goods prohibited to be imported by this Article shall be deemed to be included among the goods enumerated and described in the Table of Prohibitions and Restrictions Inwards contained in section forty-two of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, and the provisions of that Act and of any Act amending or extending that Act shall apply accordingly.

(3) If at any time a question arises under this Article whether any goods alleged to have been consigned from any country other than Italian territory were so consigned or were not grown, produced or manufactured in Italian territory, it shall be lawful for the Commissioners to require the importer to furnish to them in such form as they may direct proof in respect of the country from which the goods were consigned and in which the goods were grown, produced or manufactured, and unless proof is furnished to the satisfaction of the Commissioners that the goods were consigned from, and grown, produced or manufactured in, some country other than Italian territory, the goods shall be deemed to be goods consigned from, or grown, produced or manufactured in, Italian territory.

(4) For the purpose of this Article—

(a) goods which have been grown or produced in Italian territory and have been subjected to some process in some other country shall be deemed to be goods grown or produced, as the case may be, in Italian territory, unless it is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners that twenty-five per cent. or more of the value of the goods at the time when they left the place from which they were last consigned is attributable to a process undergone since the goods last left Italian territory; and

(b) goods which have been manufactured partly in Italian territory and partly in some other country shall be deemed to be manufactured in Italian territory, unless it is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners that twenty-five per cent. or more of

the value of the goods at the time aforesaid is attributable to processes of manufacture undergone since the goods last left Italian territory.

Prohibition of credit to Italy.

3.—(1) On and after such date as the Treasury may by order appoint, no person shall in the United Kingdom—

(a) make, contribute to, participate in, or assist in the making or issue of any loan (wherever the loan is made or issued or to be made or issued) to or for the benefit of—

(i) the government of any Italian territory; or

(ii) any person (not being a body corporate) of whatever nationality resident in any such territory; or

(iii) any person (wherever resident), being a body corporate incorporated under the law of any such territory; or

(b) offer for subscription, underwrite or otherwise assist in the issue of, or subscribe for, any shares (wherever issued or to be issued) in any such body corporate.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provisions of this Article, any person who either—

(a) by giving a guarantee or becoming a party to a bill of exchange, assumes any liability for the payment of money and thereby enables another person to raise money; or

(b) buys a bill of exchange, not being a bill payable on demand, from another person; or

(c) in connection with a sale of goods, gives credit in any form to or for the benefit of another person;

shall be deemed for the purpose of this Article to make a loan to or for the benefit of that other person:

Provided that a person shall not be deemed to make a loan by reason only that he delivers goods the price whereof has been paid on or before delivery in manner provided by Article 4 of the agreement regarding trade and payments embodied in an Exchange of Notes dated the twenty-seventh day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-five, between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and the Italian Government.

(3) Nothing in this Article shall be taken to prohibit the performance of any contract made before the date of the making of this Order with any Government or person other than such a Government or person as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (1) of this Article, but save as aforesaid the provisions of this Article shall have effect notwithstanding anything in any contract.

(4) Nothing in this Article shall apply to any loan to or for the benefit of an institution which is certified by the Treasury to have a humanitarian or religious object.

(5) If any person contravenes the provisions of this Article he shall be liable—

(a) on conviction on indictment, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years or to a fine or to both such imprisonment and a fine; or

(b) on summary conviction, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twelve months or to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine.

(6) Where a contravention of this Article by a body corporate is proved to have been committed with the consent or approval of, or to have been facilitated by any neglect on the part of, any director, manager, secretary or other officer of the body corporate, he as well as the body corporate shall be deemed to be guilty of the contravention and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.

Exercise of powers of Board of Trade.

4. Anything authorised to be done under this Order by the Board of Trade may be done by the President of the Board, or, in his absence, by a Secretary of State.

Application of Order to certain British Possessions, Protectorates and Mandated Territories.

5.—(1) This Order shall extend to the following countries, namely—

(a) the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands;

(b) all the colonies, except colonies administered by the government of a Dominion within the meaning of the Statute of Westminster, 1931;

(c) all British protectorates;

(d) all territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom.

(2) In the application of this Order to any such country as aforesaid, references to the United Kingdom shall be construed as references to that country, and this Order shall be subject to such modifications as may be made by the Governor in Council, Governor or High Commissioner of that country for adapting to the circumstances thereof the provisions of this Order.

Short title, and interpretation.

6.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) Order, 1935.

(2) In this Order the expression "Italian territory" means the Kingdom of Italy and the colonies and dependencies thereof and any territory in the effective military occupation thereof.

(3) Articles 1 and 2 of this Order shall be deemed to be an Act relating to the Customs within the meaning of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, and shall be construed as one with that Act and the enactments amending that Act, and in those Articles the expression "the Commissioners" means the Commissioners of Customs and Excise.

(4) The Interpretation Act, 1889, as amended by any subsequent enactment applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

SCHEDULE.

GOODS PROHIBITED TO BE EXPORTED TO ITALIAN TERRITORY.

PART I.

Goods prohibited to be exported as from date of Order.

1. Rifles and carbines and their barrels.
2. Machine-guns, automatic rifles, and machine pistols of all calibres, and their barrels.
3. Guns, howitzers and mortars of all calibres, their mountings, barrels and recoil mechanisms.
4. Ammunition for the arms specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Part of this Schedule; filled and unfilled projectiles and prepared propellant charges for the arms specified in paragraph 3 of this Part of this Schedule.
5. Grenades, bombs, torpedoes and mines, filled or unfilled, and apparatus for their use or discharge.
6. Tanks, armoured vehicles and armoured trains, and armour plate of all kinds.
7. Vessels of war of all kinds, including aircraft carriers and submarines.
8. Aircraft, assembled or dismantled, both heavier and lighter than air, and their propellers or air screws, fuselages, aerial gun mounts and frames, hulls, tail units and under-carriage units.
9. Aircraft engines.
10. Revolvers and automatic pistols of a weight in excess of 1 lb. 6 oz., and ammunition therefor.
11. Flame-throwers and all other projectors and machines (including smoke producing apparatus) used for chemical or incendiary warfare.
12. Mustard gas, Lewisite, Ethyldichlorarsine, Methylchlorarsine, Ethyl-iodoacetate, Chloroacetophenone, Chlorosulphonic Acid, Diphenylaminechlorarsine, Bromobenzylcyanide, Diphenylchlorarsine, Diphenylcyanarsine, Phosgene, Chlorpicrin and all other noxious substances whatsoever intended for offensive or defensive purposes in warfare.
13. Explosives of every description.

PART II.

Goods prohibited to be exported as from date appointed by the Board of Trade.

1. Iron ore and concentrates, ground, unground or briquetted.
2. Iron and steel scrap and waste.
3. Metals, unwrought, of the following descriptions, namely—
 - (a) Aluminium.
 - (b) Chromium;
 - (c) Manganese;
 - (d) Nickel;
 - (e) Tin;
 - (f) Titanium;
 - (g) Tungsten;
 - (h) Vanadium.
4. Alloys, unwrought, containing any metal specified in paragraph 3 of this Part of this Schedule, including ferro-alloys but excluding

steel and alloy steel; ores, concentrates and residues, ground, unground or briquetted, and matte containing any such metal: and scrap and waste of the said metals.

5. Aluminium oxide (but not including abrasives).
6. Ferro-molybdenum.
7. Ferro-silicon.
8. Rubber (raw), including crepe; rubber latex.
9. Waste, scrap and reclaimed rubber.
10. Horses, mules, donkeys, camels, and all other transport animals.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the County of Kent now vested in us:

“Whereas the property, particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written, is now vested in us not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but in possession and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be authorised and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to transfer or convey from time to time all or part of the said property described in the said Schedule for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Canterbury.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before Your Majesty in

Council, a Scheme bearing date the 17th day of October, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Hoxne and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Denham (Saint John), both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Hoxne and Denham (Saint John) duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, including an alteration of the boundaries of the Parish of the said Benefice of Hoxne and of the Parish of the Benefice of Wilby, in the

said County of Suffolk, and in the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said two Benefices of Hoxne and Denham (Saint John) are now full being held together in plurality by the Reverend James Kirkman Wood under the authority of a Dispensation:

"And whereas the Patronage of each of the said Benefices of Hoxne and Denham (Saint John) now belongs to one and the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said James Kirkman Wood (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Hoxne and the said Benefice of Denham (Saint John) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Hoxne with Denham (Saint John)' but that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect and the said James Kirkman Wood if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Hoxne and Denham (Saint John) shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his tenure of the said Benefices of Hoxne and Denham (Saint John) shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hoxne shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That with the consent of the Reverend Henry Spelman Marriott, as Patron and also as the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Wilby (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect all that detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Hoxne containing Hoxne Hill Farm which is comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Wilby shall be transferred

and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Wilby, but no alteration of the endowments of either of such Benefices shall be made by reason of such transfer of territory.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"And whereas Miss Violet Edith Wills, of Bel Alp, Haytor, in the County of Devon, Spinster, as the contributor of the above mentioned capital sum has nominated to us herself, the said Violet Edith Wills, the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, Brigadier-General Frank Dutton Frost, C.B.E., M.C., of Watersmeet, Moulsoford-on-Thames, in the County of Berks, the Reverend Colin Causton Kerr, of Number 5, Osborne Mansions, London, Clerk in Holy Orders, and Hubert Karl Archibald, of Number 5, Harley Gardens, The Boltons, London, Esquire, as the persons to whom she desires that the Patronage and right of nomination and presentation of and to the said District or New Parish of Saint Catherine, Mile Cross, should be assigned, and we are satisfied that the said assignment may properly be effected:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Catherine, Mile Cross, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Violet Edith Wills; Bertram, Bishop of

Norwich; Frank Dutton Frost; Colin Causton Kerr; and Hubert Karl Archibald, their heirs and assigns for ever, as Trustees upon the trusts declared by a certain Deed already prepared and intended to be executed by the said Violet Edith Wills; Bertram, Bishop of Norwich; Frank Dutton Frost; Colin Causton Kerr; and Hubert Karl Archibald.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act or of any other Act of Parliament."

THE MERCHANDISE MARKS (IMPORTED GOODS) EXEMPTION DIRECTION (No. 4), 1935, DATED 24TH OCTOBER, 1935, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES, THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR THE HOME DEPARTMENT AND THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR SCOTLAND ACTING JOINTLY UNDER SECTION 3 (1) OF THE MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926 (16 & 17 GEO. 5. c. 53).

Whereas by Section 3, sub-section (1) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16 and 17 Geo. 5. c. 53) it is provided that if, where an Order in Council has been made under that Act with respect to any goods, it is shown to the satisfaction of the Appropriate Department by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter that the application of the provisions of the Order or of some of those provisions to any particular class or description of those goods has caused or is likely to cause injury or hardship to the said persons or any of them, the Department may direct that the Order or any particular provisions of the Order shall cease to apply to goods of that class or description or shall apply to such goods subject only to such modifications and conditions as the Department think fit, and the Order shall, while the Direction is in force, have effect subject thereto:

And whereas it is provided by Article 1 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 7 Order, 1934,* that it shall not be lawful to import (among other things) any chilled beef or frozen pork or to sell or expose for sale in the United Kingdom (among other things) any imported chilled beef or frozen pork unless such meat bears an indication of origin; and by Article 2 of the said Order that the indication of origin shall be branded, or stamped, stencilled or printed in ink or stain, durably and conspicuously, in letters which shall except as therein provided be not less than one-half of one inch in height; and by Paragraphs I, III and IV of Article 3 of the said Order that the indication of origin required on importation shall be applied as follows, that is to say—

I. In the case of chilled beef, each side of chilled beef shall bear the indication of origin on the outer side in a continuous series of words in three columns extending longitudinally:—

(i) from the hock joint to the neck, in a line passing over the round, aitchbone and rump and then continuing at a distance of two inches from the chine bone to the neck; and

(ii) from the hind leg or shin to the foreshin in a line drawn down the middle of the side; and

(iii) from the fore-rib or crop to the sticking in a line drawn midway between the lines specified in (i) and (ii),

as shown in the diagram, Figure I, in the Schedule to the Order.

III. In the case of frozen pork, each carcase shall bear the indication of origin on each side of the carcase on the outer side

of the leg, loin, fore-end (spare-rib and blade-bone) and hand-and-spring, composing four marks on each side in the positions shown in the diagram, Figure III, in the Schedule to the Order.

IV. Except where any portion of (among other things) a carcase of frozen pork is one of the forms of meat specified in the next following paragraph of the Order, each portion of any such carcase shall bear such markings indicative of origin as it would have borne if it had formed part of a complete carcase of such meat which had been marked in the manner hereinbefore in the Article prescribed.

and by Paragraph I of Article 4 of the said Order, that the indication of origin required on sale and exposure for sale, whether wholesale or by retail, shall be applied as follows, that is to say—

I. In the case of chilled beef and frozen pork, in like manner as on importation.

And whereas representations have been made on behalf of the High Commissioner of the Union of South Africa that Regulations have been made by the Government of the Union of South Africa requiring chilled beef exported from that Dominion to bear the name of the country of origin applied to it in the following manner:—

AFRICA

and that the application of the aforesaid provisions of Article 3 of the said Order without modification is likely to cause hardship.

And whereas the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, being the Appropriate Department in this case, are satisfied that hardship is likely to be caused by the application of the aforesaid provisions of Article 3 of the said Order to such chilled beef before the said representations have been further considered.

And whereas the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, as aforesaid and being the Appropriate Department in this case are also satisfied, after consideration of representations made to them by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter, that hardship is likely to be caused to the said persons by the application of the aforesaid provisions of Articles 3 and 4 of the said Order to certain portions of carcasses of frozen pork, namely, frozen loins and shoulder cuts of pork from which the skin has been removed prior to importation.

Now, therefore, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 3 of the said Act hereby direct as follows:—

CHILLED BEEF.

1. The provisions of Article 3 of the said Order requiring an indication of origin on importation shall apply to chilled beef imported from the Union of South Africa subject to this modification, that is to say, the indication of origin may be applied by means of the three words

placed vertically one beneath the other in a continuous series of words in three columns in the positions specified in the said Paragraph I of Article 3 of the said Order.

FROZEN PORK.

2. The provisions of Paragraph IV of Article 3 and Paragraph I of Article 4 of the said Order shall not apply to loins and shoulder cuts of frozen pork from which the skin has been removed prior to importation; and

3. The provisions of Paragraph V of Article 3 and Paragraph II of Article 4 of the said Order shall apply to such meat as though the descriptions "loins of frozen pork from which the skin has been removed prior to importation" and "shoulder cuts of frozen pork from which the skin has been removed prior to importation" had been added to the forms of meat specified in these paragraphs.

GENERAL.

4. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 4), 1935, and shall come into operation on the 31st October, 1935.
