##### FLAX AND HEMP TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

##### PROPOSAL TO VARY AND TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with regulations made by the Minister of Labour under section 18 of the Trade Board Act, 1909, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Flax and Hemp Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the general minimum time rates and overtime rates for certain classes of male workers of twenty-one years of age or over employed in tenting and for male improvers to tenting at present set out in the Schedule to the Notice F.H. (34) dated 18th January, 1935, and TO FIX a general minimum time rate and overtime rates for a certain class of improvers to tenting.
