

each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto, as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

Where the Certificate is in the form of a label the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the package containing the meat and if the label has not in any other circumstances, or on any other occasion, been used as an Official Certificate; and where the Certificate is in the form of a stamp the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed on the container.


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SCHEDULE.
