LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

*East Norfolk Rivers (including the River Waveney) Catchment Area.*

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries hereby gives notice that the East Norfolk Rivers (including the River Waveney) Catchment Board have made application under subsection (3) of Section 5 of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, that the statutory map of the Catchment Area be varied by the addition of certain water-courses to the "main river" of the Catchment Area as at present defined on the map.

A copy of a map on the 1-inch scale, on which the proposed additions are shown in red colour and numbered 1 to 19, may be inspected, together with a copy of the statutory map, at the offices of the Clerk of the Catchment Board, 8, Orford Hill, Norwich, or at the offices of the Ministry. Any objection to the proposed variation of the statutory map shall be made in writing and sent by post, addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, at the address mentioned below, so as to reach that office within thirty-one days from the date of this notice.

*River Great Ouse Catchment Board.*

*East Harling Internal Drainage Board.*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him under Section 4 (3) of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, proposes to make an Order confirming a scheme submitted to him by the River Great Ouse Catchment Board under Section 4 (1) (b) of the Act, making provision for the extension of the period of office of the first members of the East Harling Internal Drainage Board.

LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

*East Norfolk Rivers (including the River Waveney) Catchment Board.*

*Happisburgh to Winterton Internal Drainage District.*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming the Order made on the 7th October, 1935, in relation to the Scheme prepared by the East Norfolk Rivers (including the River Waveney) Catchment Board, under Section 4 (1) (b) of the Act, making provision for the constitution of the Happisburgh to Winterton Internal Drainage District, which Order has now come into force.

A copy of the Order may be seen at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Clerk of the Catchment Board, 8, Orford Hill, Norwich, and also at the offices of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, 10, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.1.

By Part III of the Second Schedule to the said Act, it is provided that if any person aggrieved by an Order desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, he may, within six weeks after the publication of this notice make an application for the purpose to the High Court, and if any such application is duly made, the Court, if satisfied that the Order is not within the powers of the Act or that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any requirements of the Act not having been complied with, may quash the Order either generally or in so far as it affects the applicant.
