

shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop of Bristol for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Bedminster and of the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Knowle, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Barnabas, Knowle.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other

measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Barnabas, Knowle, comprising:—

"1. All that portion of the Parish of Bedminster, in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon part of the west by the District Chapelry of Saint Dunstan, Bedminster, upon the remaining part of the west and upon the south-west by the New Parish of Saint Peter, Bishopsworth, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the south-east partly by the Parish of Whitchurch in the said County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells and partly by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Christopher, Brislington, in the said County of Somerset and in the said Diocese of Bristol, upon the east by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Martin, Knowle, upon the north-east by the New Parish of the Holy Nativity, Knowle, both in the said County of Somerset and in the said Diocese of Bristol, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Nativity, Knowle, from the said Parish of Bedminster, at the junction of Redcatch Road with Beckington Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Beckington Road and of the southern branch of Beckington Road for a distance of 17½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the proposed footpath leading to Wedmore Vale, and extending thence first westward to and then first westward and then south-westward along the middle of the said proposed footpath for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the north-eastern side of Wedmore Vale near its junction with Glyn Vale, and extending thence first westward across Wedmore Vale to and then south-westward along the middle of Glyn Vale for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Clonmel Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Clonmel Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lurgan Walk and Kildare Road, and extending thence westward to and along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the roadway leading to the northern end of the site for the proposed Merrywood School for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the site for the said proposed school, and extending thence first north-westward and then south-westward along the walls or fences forming the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of such proposed school site for a distance in all of 15 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of Nover's Common, and extending thence first south-westward and then in various directions along the walls or fences forming the south-eastern, southern, and south-western boundaries of Nover's Common for a distance in all of 14 chains or
